Coach Pritty is hanging up his whistle and retiring his topographic maps! After 30 years of teaching and coaching at Markham DHS, Mr. Greg Pritty is retiring. Coach Pritty is proud to have only taught at MDHS over his entire teaching career, which started on Tuesday, September 8th, 1987.For his entire teaching career at MDHS, Mr. Pritty has only taught geography which is his passion after he earned a Bachelor's degree in geography from McMaster University. Using an educated guess, it is estimated that Mr. P. has taught over 5,000 geography students while at MDHS! When he was not teaching geography, Mr. Pritty was coaching football. For over 30 autumns, he coached hundreds and hundreds of football players. Many of these players went on to earn starting positions at many Canadian universities. A few of his players even made it to the CFL! Over his coaching career, he is proud to have won 15 YRAA football championships. However, his proudest coaching moment was when he helped coach MDHS to win the 2009 OFSAA Senior Metro Bowl championship. This was a very proud moment for coach and MDHS as thousands of students, fans and alumni filled the lower bowl of the Rogers Centre to see the big win. In total, Mr. Pritty coached 247 games for MDHS with a win/loss record of 188-59. This means his teams won 76% of the time they played! Tuesday, Feb. 27th will be his last day at Markham. He is excited for his next stage of his life as he moves with his wife, Wanda to a beautiful cottage-home in the Mattawa area. All current staff and students, along with thousands of former students, wish you the best as you take on the next stage of your life. Coach! Thank you for all your many years of dedication to teaching and coaching for so many students living in Markham. You will be much missed in the classroom and on the football field!




