# Flu Season is on its way - are you ready?



Flu season is nearly here. Be prepared by getting the flu shot as early as possible.

The first and best step to preventing influenza (the flu), is to get the flu shot every year. Influenza spreads quickly and easily from an infected person to others.

Everyone six months of age and older can get the flu shot.

Flu shots are available at:

- · Health care provider's offices for people six months of age and older
- Participating pharmacies, for people five years of age and older

Visit ontario.ca/flu to find where you can get the flu shot.

How can the flu be avoided?

- Get the flu shot!
- <u>Wash your hands</u> well and often with soap and warm water. If soap and water are unavailable, use an alcohol-based <u>hand sanitizer</u>
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze and throw the tissue out immediately. Wash your hands afterward. Cough into your upper sleeve if you don't have a tissue.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth
- Avoid large crowds and stay home when you are sick
- Keep common surfaces and items clean and disinfected



# Tamil Heritage Month 2018 Poster/ Poetry Contest Details



#### Background:

Tamils began migrating to Ontario as early as the 1940s. Since then Tamil Canadians have overcome tremendous obstacles and have made significant contributions to the growth and prosperity of Ontario. For Tamil Canadians, the Tamil Harvest Festival, Thai Pongal, takes place in January. Thai Pongal is celebrated on the first day of the month *Thai* of the Tamil calendar. This year, the Thai Pongal Day is celebrated on, January 14, 2018 by Tamils in Canada and around the world.

By proclaiming the month of January as Tamil Heritage Month, the Federal government of Canada recognizes the valuable contributions that Tamil Canadians have made to Ontario's social, economic, political and cultural fabric. - Open to all York Region District School Board Students, Grades 3 11.
- One entry per student.
- The artist's name must appear only on the Entry Form and not on the poster or the poem itself.

- Participants can create work on paper or canvass and scan it into a JPEG file
