

CANADIAN PARENTS FOR FRENCH CONCOURS d'art oratoire Canada's French Public Speaking Contest

Backgrounder:

This year marked the 34th anniversary of CPF Ontario's *Concours d'art oratoire* and the second year of the Impromptu Division. Participating students in Grades 4 to 12 are enrolled in the various French Second Language programs in Ontario schools: Core French, Extended French and French Immersion.

A total of 313 students from across Ontario qualified for this year's event. An estimated 20,000 students participated at the classroom, school, and school board level over the past four months. Of the **313 provincial finalists**, 85 competed in the Impromptu Division where students have only 15 minutes to prepare an otherwise spontaneous speech based on a visual or written prompt. Students in the Traditional division presented their speeches at the public-speaking festival and the secondary school finalists competed for cash prizes. The first-place winners of the Grades 11-12 level have also each won a \$4,000 scholarship to York University's Glendon College or the University of Ottawa. The finalists in the Traditional Division will move on to represent Ontario at the 2018 *CPF National Concours d'art oratoire* on June 2nd, 2018 in Ottawa.

At the **2018 CPF National Concours d'art oratoire (Traditional Division)**, finalists from across Canada compete for scholarships the University of Ottawa, the University of Moncton, the Université de Saint-Boniface and the Université Sainte-Anne with a combined value of over \$500,000.

There are close to **980,000** students enrolled in French Immersion, Extended French or Core French in Ontario's English school system. The latest Ministry of Education enrolment figures (2015-2016) confirm French Immersion enrolment has increased 5.7 percent annually over the last ten-year period with more than 212,000 students currently enrolled. More and more parents recognize the cognitive, cultural and employment benefits of official language bilingualism in Canada and in today's global environment.

According to the 2011 Federal Census, of the 13.4 million people living in Ontario, 11 percent or 1,470,260 self-identify as having knowledge of both French and English¹.
