#### <u>University Pathways Program</u>

The University Pathways Program is a collaboration between three Canadian business schools -- Ivey Business School at Western University, Schulich School of Business at York University, and Smith School of Business at Queen's University. It is designed to <u>support self-identified Black</u> <u>students in their post-secondary academic journeys</u>, as a way to address the significant under-representation of Black students in Canadian university enrolment, including in business schools. The first cohort of the program started in January 2023 with 55 students from across the Greater Toronto Area (GTA).

Some key facts:

The program is no-cost to participants;

Mentoring by current Black university students is a key element;

Enrollment is by student application and approval. Applications for the fall 2023 start will open at the end of May;

Students begin the program while in grade 11;

Content includes insights on the university experience from current Black undergraduate students, and learning about pre-requisites and requirements for programs so high school students have the time, experiential learning opportunities, and support networks to prepare for postsecondary education;

The program is primarily delivered online via Zoom sessions outside of school hours. There are occasional in-person activities that provide a chance to visit the campuses of participating universities;

The Program offers significant financial support options to reduce the financial barrier to post-secondary education;

The program is currently only available to Black students based in the GTA.

#### National Indigenous Peoples Day

June 21 was declared National Indigenous Peoples Day in 1996 by then Governor General Romeo Leblanc. The day was chosen in consultation with some national organizations for Indigenous peoples including the Assembly of First Nations, and coincides with the summer solstice which is significant for some First Nations. With the ongoing location of graves at Residential schools over the past 12 months the nation is slowly coming to grips with the horrors of the Residential School program. Examining the truths of Canada's colonial past and present is important work and should continue to drive our examination of bias and what Canadian history has tried to deny for so long. The importance of today, however, is to uplift and affirm Indigenous identities by including positive representations. The 21st has become a day for celebration in many Indigenous communities. It is a day for showing pride in their living cultures and to demonstrate a resurgence of ways of being, thinking and speaking. Join us today in celebrating the diverse cultures of First Nations, Métis and Inuit communities, the original people of Turtle Island.
