

Who are South Asians?

According to the Canadian Encyclopedia, <u>South Asian Canadians</u> trace their origins to South Asia, which encompasses India, Pakistan, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka. Most South Asian Canadians are immigrants or descendants of immigrants from these countries, but immigrants from South Asian communities established during British colonial times also include those from East and South Africa, Guyana, Trinidad and Tobago, Fiji and Mauritius. [Some South Asian Canadians come from Britain, the US and Europe. In the 2016 census, 1,963,330 Canadians reported South Asian origins (1,603,000 single and 360,330 multiple responses)".

If you are a singer, dancer, actor, musician, magician, or comedian, performing solo or as a group, you are invited to audition for the annual Rising Star competition at the Canadian National Exhibition (CNE). Selected competitors will perform at the 2023 CNE.

DIVISIONS

There are two age divisions in the competition:

- Junior Rising Star: 6 to 12 years of age
- 2. Youth Rising Star: 13 to 21 years of age

Contestants are judged by a panel based on the following orberia:

Natural Acatey	20,000
Stage Presence / Showmanship	20%
Audience Appeal	20%
Quality of Performance	40%

All contestants including last year's finalists must have an audition with the Canadian National Exhibition's production staff to be eligible to compete in the talent competition. Decisions made by CNE staff and judges are final. No. discussion shall be entered into with the contestants and the judges or CNE staff regarding contest decisions. Matters not covered by the stated rules are respired. at the sole discretion of the CNE staff.

HOW TO ENTER

- Complete an entry form online at www.theek.com/risingstar. Entry forms must be received by the CNE no later than Friday, May 26, 2023. The administrator may choose to accept or refuse entry forms that are late, incomplete or illegible.
- Along with your entry form, a YouTube video link must be submitted at the same time or before the deadline. All audition within the last 12 months. Your audition video must represent how you will be performing, if selected, on our stage. Do not send in a video of you singing with a band unless the whole band is entering as well. Only one performance is permitted per YouTube submission. When preparing your YouTube video, make sure to list your full name in the title of your video. Videos not properly labelled may not be considered.
- 3. Contestants acknowledge that the CNE is not affiliated in any way with YouTube and a submission made by a contestant via YouTube is the sole responsibility of the contestant, including the ability of the CNE to access the submission. Any YouTube submissions that cannot be accessed by the CNE for

- any reason whatsoever will be deemed not to have been received. Contestants are responsible for compliance with YouTube's Terms of Use.
- The judges will consist of a panel chosen by the administrator. The judges will review all video entries and score them. according to our judging criteria.

SHOW DATES

The contest, which consists of preliminaries, semi-finals and finals will run during the CNE. August 18 to September 4, 2023

PRIZES

The Junior Grand Champion receives \$1,000 and the first runner up. 9750. Second through fifth runners-up receive \$500, \$300, \$200 and

The Youth Grand Champion receives \$2,500. and the first runner up, \$1,500. Second through fifth runners-up receive \$700, \$500, \$300 and \$200 respectively.

NOTE: All participants are awarded souvenirs of the contest as they advance through the preliminaries, semi-finals and finals.

The structure of the competition may change without notice.

Please Read Carefully - Entry Guidelines

- This competition is open to legal residents 7. of Ontario only. You can only enter once.
- Junior Rising Star: All contestants must be at least 6 years of age and not older than 8. 12 by September 2, 2023.
- Youth Rising Star: All contestants must be at least 13 years of age and not older than 21 by September 3, 2023.
- The age divisions of contestants in dust or groups will be determined by average 999
- A performance must be no more than 4 minutes 30 seconds in duration. Any act running over this time will be disqualified. Timing begins with the first word, note.
- Acts using machetes, knives, baton weapons and rigging (circus acts) cannot enter. Fire and/or pyrotechnics are not allowed on stage at any time. Profane language, awearing or suggestive lyrics or actions that are not suitable for a family audience (as determined by the administrator or the judge) will not be accepted. The administrator or the judge may refuse to accept an entry containing any of the aforesaid.

- Once again, the competition will be held on a stage indoors. Therefore, sound level 12. As a condition of the confestant being restrictions will be in effect.
- An individual may not enter the competition if they are: 1) a CNE full-time or contract employee: 20 a member of the CNEA Membership or Board of Directors: 3) a contractor and/or agent of the CNE directly involved in the competition: 4). any other persons directly associated with the competition; 5) a member of the immediate families of any of the aforesaid persons or any other person residing in the same household.
- Contestants who do not appear one halfhour prior to the competition or fall to remain until the end of the show, will be disqualified.
- 10. If you are selected for the competition. as a vocalist, we ask that you prepar a backup song. This is to ensure that, should you be chosen to perform in the Competition Finals, that there is no duplication in the repertoire presented onstage.
