Let's get cycling!

Celebrate active modes of transportation like cycling and wheeling along with other students and staff across Ontario during **Bike to School Week** -**May 29-June 2, 2023**. **Bike to School Week** is a free and fun week-long celebration for kids of all ages and abilities.



When cycling, remember to:

- Wear a properly fitting helmet. Every cyclist under 18 must wear a bike helmet.
- Air Brakes Chain Check your bike tires, brakes and chain before you start riding.
- Ensure your bike has a working bell, white light or reflector at the front, and a red light or reflector at the back. For information and to learn more visit the <u>Government of Ontario's</u> <u>bicycle safety information</u>.
- Cross at crosswalks, if there is one. Walk beside your bike when crossing the road.
- Watch for cars backing out of driveways and turning at intersections.
- Lock your bike in bike racks.
- Be visible and dress for the weather.

For anyone who can't walk or cycle to school every day, we encourage you to try choosing an active mode of travel two or three times a week, or consider parking and walking a block to decrease the pollution around your school.

Benefits of Biking to School

- · Promotes physical and mental health
- Students arrive energized and ready to learn
- Improved safety in school zones
- Good for the environment
- Convenient, bicycling is often faster than sitting in traffic
- Good for the community, encourages social interaction
- Promotes life-long habits that foster independence and active lifestyles, preparing children for their future
- Just plain old simple fun!

Cycling Safety Factsheet

Be Seen - Be Heard - Be Safe

Did you know?

Ontario law requires that you equip your bike with:

- White reflective tape on the front forks and red reflective tape on the rear forks
- A white front light and a red rear light or reflector if you ride between 1/2 hour before sunset and 1/2 hour after sunrise
- A bell or horn that works



Every cyclist under 18 years of age must wear an approved bicycle helmet Graphic and more information can be found at York Region Cycling education webpage.



If you are a singer, dancer, actor, musician, magician, or comedian, performing solo or as a group, you are invited to audition for the annual Rising Star competition at the Canadian National Exhibition (CNE). Selected competitors will perform at the 2023 CNE.

DIVISIONS

There are two age divisions in the competition:

- Junior Rising Star: 6 to 12 years of age
- 2. Youth Rising Star: 13 to 21 years of age

JUDGING

- Contestants are judged by a panel based on the following orberia: Natural Ability 2026 Stage Presence / Showmanship 20% Audience Appeal 20%
- Quality of Performance 40% 2. All contestants including last year's
- finalists must have an audition with the Canadian National Exhibition's production staff to be eligible to compete in the talent competition. Decisions made by CNE staff and judges are final. No. discussion shall be entered into with the contestants and the judges or CNE staff regarding contest decisions. Matters not covered by the stated rules are resolved. at the sole discretion of the CNE staff.

HOW TO ENTER

1.

- Complete an entry form online at www.theek.com/risingstar. Entry forms must be received by the CNE no later than Friday, May 25, 2023, The administrator may choose to accept or refuse entry forms that are late, incomplete or illegible.
- Along with your entry form, a YouTube 22 video link must be submitted at the same time or before the deadline. All audition material must have been recorded within the last 12 months. Your audition video must represent how you will be performing, if selected, on our stage. Do not send in a video of you singing with a band unless the whole band is entering as well. Only one performance is permitted per YouTube submission. When preparing your YouTube video, make sure to list your full name in the title of your video. Videos not properly labelled may not be considered.
- **X** Contestants acknowledge that the CNE is not affiliated in any way with YouTube and a submission made by a contestant via YouTube is the sole responsibility of the contestant, including the ability of the CNE to access the submission. Any YouTube submissions that cannot be accessed by the CNE for

any reason whatsoever will be deemed not to have been received. Contestants are responsible for compliance with YouTube's Terms of Use

The judges will consist of a panel chosen by the administrator. The judges will review all video entries and score them. according to our judging criteria

SHOW DATES

The contest, which consists of preliminaries, semi-finals and finals will run during the CNE. August 19 to September 4, 2023

PRIZES

The Junior Grand Champion receives \$1,000 and the first runner up. \$750. Second through Eith runners-up receive \$500, \$300, \$200 and \$100 respectively.

The Youth Grand Champion receives \$2,500 and the first runner up, \$1,500. Second through fifth runners-up receive \$700, \$500, \$300 and \$200 respectively.

NOTE: All participants are awarded souvenirs of the contest as they advance through the preliminaries, semi-finals and finals.

The structure of the competition may change without notice.

Please Read Carefully - Entry Guidelines

- This competition is open to legal residents 7. of Ontario only. You can only enter once.
- Junior Rising Star: All contestants must be at least 6 years of age and not older than 8. 12 by September 2, 2023.
- Youth Rising Star: All contestants must be ж. at least 13 years of age and not older than 21 by September 3, 2025.
- The age divisions of contestants in dust or groups will be determined by average 2020
- A performance must be no more than 4 minutes 30 seconds in duration. Any act running over this time will be disqualified. Timing begins with the first word, note, or action.
- 6. Acts using machetes, knives, baton weapons and rigging (circus acts) cannot enter. Fire and/or pyrotechnics are not. allowed on stage at any time. Profane language, swearing or suggestive lyrics or actions that are not suitable for a family audience (as determined by the administrator or the judge) will not be accepted. The administrator or the judge may refuse to accept an entry containing any of the aforesaid.

- Once again, the competition will be held on a stage indoors. Therefore, sound level 12. As a condition of the contestant being restrictions will be in effect.
- An individual may not enter the competition if they are: 1) a CNE full-time. or contract employee: 2) a member of the CNEA Membership or Board of Directory. 3) a contractor and/or agent of the CNE directly involved in the competition: 4). any other persons directly associated with the competition; 5) a member of the immediate families of any of the aforesaid persons or any other person residing in the serve household.
- Contestants who do not appear one half-9. hour prior to the competition or fail to remain until the end of the show, will be disgualified.
- 10. If you are selected for the competition as a vocalist, we ask that you prepar a backup song. This is to ensure that, should you be chosen to perform in the Competition Finals, that there is no duplication in the repertoire presented ornstarde.
- 1. Contestants selected to advance to the preliminaries will be notified around the

beginning of July.

- permitted to compete in the Rising Star Competition, each contestant (A) grants permission to the CNE to use, without compensation of any kind, any photograph. audio, or video tapes or other audio or visual images or recordings, including digital recordings, in such manner as the CNE may determine including any promotions or advertising, and (B) waives any right to any fee or compensation. for any of the aforesaid and (C) releases the CNE from any loss, demage, injury or expense, which the contestant may suffer or incur as a result of his or her. participation in the event, however caused.
- 18. A previous Junior Grand Champion can enter the Youth competition once they reach the age of 13. A previous Youth Grand Champion cannot enter again.
- Ы. All audition videos must be a live recording. Videos that have a voice dubbed in will not be accepted. Audition video must represent how you would be performing in the competition. Videos should have a clean sound. no reverberation.
