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Getting Ready for Mental Health Awareness Week

Dear Families and Caregivers,

Every year, the first full week of May is designated as Mental Health Awareness Week by the Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA). This annual event aims to raise awareness and promote understanding of mental health across Canada. This year's theme is Unmasking Mental Health. Unmasking mental health may be defined as increasing our mental health literacy, promoting positive mental health, reducing stigma around mental health, and understanding the resources available to us. In this edition we will focus on unmasking mental health and the tools made available by the YRDSB for parents and caregivers to support their children's mental health.

One way the York Region District School Board is unmasking mental health is through its <u>Student Mental Health and Addictions Strategy</u> which aims to in part: advance students' mental health and well-being through promotion of health and support when needed, in a way that honours the student where they are. This year's theme could be an opportunity for you to pause and reflect and open a conversation with your child(ren) exploring the question: what does unmasking mental health mean to you and your child, recognizing the rich diversity of perspectives and understandings as it pertains to mental health within our student community.

Each year, the YRDSB recognizes mental health awareness week through a variety of activities and initiatives supporting its students within the classroom and parents/caregivers in the community. The Central Mental Health Team has prepared a <u>toolkit</u> that includes themed days and activities you can consider doing with your child in support of mental health and mental health awareness.
