STUDENT EXAMINATION INFORMATION

1. Examination Schedule

Confirm your exam/interview/performance date (if applicable) with your classroom teacher. Record the date and time in your cell phone calendar. Plan to be at school at least fifteen minutes prior to the beginning of the exam/culminating activity. All written exams begin at 8:20 a.m.

2. Transportation

Buses will maintain their regular schedule.

3. Absence

Students should not be absent during the exam period for family vacations. Illness is the only legitimate reason to be absent for an exam. In the event of illness, you should telephone the school office (905) 294-1886.

Information required will be the subject, grade and teacher name. An administrator will reach out with next steps

4. Lateness

If you are less than 15 minutes late, please report directly to the exam. If you are more than 15 minutes late, please report to the main office.

5. No Materials Brought In

Notes and paper are not to be brought in to the exam room, unless previously confirmed by the classroom teacher. Backpacks, binders and jackets should be left in lockers; they are not to be brought to the exam room. Electronic devices (including cell phones and music devices) are not permitted in exam rooms.

6. Consequences of Inappropriate Behaviour

Students not adhering to the rules and conditions of the exam area will be brought to the office by a staff member.

7. Upon completion of your exam/culminating activity

Once student have completed their exam/culminating activity, they are expected to exit the building or wait quietly in the cafeteria until they depart. Students are not permitted to be in the halls as other exams/culminating activities may still be in progress.

8. Severe/Inclement Weather and Transportation

In the event of bus cancellation because of storm conditions, examinations for that day only will be rescheduled. All other examinations will be written as scheduled. If an exam has to be rescheduled due to inclement weather, the exams for that date will be rescheduled to Thursday, February 1, 2024.

When the decision about school transportation and school closures is made, the board does so as early as possible, and no later than 6:00 a.m. The YRDSB will do their best to notify families in advance when they may be considering closing school and Board offices. While we have seen milder **winter weather** this year, I also want to remind families that we have protocols in place for <u>severe</u> <u>weather</u> and school transportation cancellation in the case of inclement weather, and want to ensure families are aware. Early in February, we will be celebrating <u>Winter Walk Day</u>, and be sharing tips as well as the benefits and joys of winter walking.

This month, students in Grades 5-12 will have an opportunity to vote in the **Student Trustee Elections**. I want to congratulate and thank all of the students in Grade 10 and 11 who applied for this position. Student Trustees play an important role representing student voice at the Board meetings, and we greatly value their voice and contributions. Students who are eligible to vote will receive information in their GAPPS accounts about how to vote. This is a great opportunity to participate in the democratic process and to have their say about who will represent their voice in the next school year.

<u>Kindergarten</u> and <u>French Immersion</u> registration opened in January for fall 2024. For students looking at course selection in secondary school, there are lots of great resources available at <u>www.yrdsb.ca/experience-yrdsb</u> that let students learn more about courses, programs and opportunities that relate to their interests.

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PA Day February 2, 2024

The focus of the February 2, 2024 Professional Activity Day is Violence Prevention and Curriculum Implementation.

Morning (150 minutes)

Topic: Violence Prevention (Facilitated by Administrators)

Details: This module is designed to support all staff in:

- developing relationships and identity-affirming working and learning environments;
- identifying warning signs that a person's behaviour may be escalating;
- responding to escalations using specific strategies;
- exploring case studies; following reporting procedures; and accessing support and resources.

Topic: Equitable Assessment Practices Professional Learning Series #2

Details: School teams will engage in professional learning facilitated by school administrators focusing on:

- implementing the fundamental principles of equitable assessment and evaluation;
- addressing self-identified barriers to equitable assessment and evaluation; and developing next steps within schools and/or departments.

Topic: SIP/Department Meetings

Details: School teams will engage School Improvement planning led by school administrators focusing on:

- high-impact instructional practices to support student improvement in alignment with the curriculum;
- developing resources and learning plans to consolidate foundational knowledge and skills in de-streamed grade 9 courses and across the curriculum; supporting Multi Language Learners in our classrooms; and developing equitable assessment practices.

Afternoon (150 minutes)

Topic: Making Learning Accessible for MLLs Using the STEP Continua

Details: This module is the third in a series of required learning intended for secondary educators, administrators and support staff. To build on the content from modules 1 and 2, educators will explore approaches guided by the STEP continua that create entry points to learning for Step 1/Step 2 learners across all subject areas.

Details: School teams will engage School Improvement planning led by school administrators focusing on:

- high-impact instructional practices to support student improvement in alignment with the curriculum,
