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Parking Lot Safety Reminders

- Please use the parking lot at the front of the school (west parking lot) for all drop-offs and pickups.
- The fire routes/drop off area is a "no standing zone". Please park in the parking lot if you arrive early. Vehicles should not be waiting in the drop off loop or in front of the school, to avoid being ticketed by city by law officers.
- To avoid congestion and to increase the flow of traffic, please do not double park and keep all lanes open to allow cars to exit the parking lot. If you arrive early to pick up your student, please park in a spot in the parking lot to keep the lanes clear.
- Please do not block the crosswalks as this is for pedestrian traffic and safe access to the parking lot.
- Do not park in an accessible parking space, if you or your passenger do not hold a valid permit.
- Be vigilant of pedestrians who are using the sidewalks at the school entrances/exits.
