7. Principal's Report

- Great Grade 9 day. No rain !
- Had an online drop-in session for parents/guardians prior to start of school on September 2; approximately 200 parents in attendance
- Reviewed changes with class formats for this year
- o Lunch
 - Have several locations including outside
 - Realize outside won't always be available when weather gets colder
 - Cafeteria divided by grade section
 - $\circ~$ Will also make Gymnasium available at lunch, and will have tables in the halls
 - Students required to leave classrooms between classes for cleaning purposes
 - Student population this year is approximately 1,340 students; there are approximately 100 students registered for online schooling
- New process for entering school
 - Friday was a bit slower given it was the first day back for all students; students thanked for their patience
 - Today students managed to check into the school in 20 minutes
 - Screening is working efficiently
 - Students being allowed to enter school at 7:50 a.m.
- o Student Activities fees are being reviewed for the school year
 - Also reviewing what activities students can participate in this year
- Staff have been working on Mental Health support for students
 - Trying to ensure there is support for students
