# **Online Learning Graduation Requirement**


- Students must either successfully complete 2 online (asynchronous) learning credits to earn an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD).

If you wish to opt out of the online graduation requirement, you must complete the opt-out option available on myBlueprint (with parent/guardian approval).







# Individual Pathways Plan (IPP)

This is the primary planning tool as you progress through school towards your initial post-secondary destination.

(Creating Pathways to Success 2012)

Complete a four-step inquiry process from grades 7–12 based on 4 questions linked to four areas of learning. The web-based tool used is the IPP in myBlueprint.



# **Course Selection Requirements for Grade 11**

- Select 8 courses plus 2 alternates (repertoire counts as a 9th course)If you plan to select repertoire:
- \*\*\*First load your 8 primary courses then click on "+ repertoire" to add AMR
- Review myBlueprint to check if you are missing any graduation requirements (such as art, group 1, 2 and 3 credits)



- Be mindful of your future post-secondary plans and select appropriate courses to meet potential admission requirements
- Grade 11 course choices will impact what you can take in Grade 12
- When selecting Grade 11 English, you will choose between NBE3C (Grade 11 College), NBE3U (Grade 11 University) or NBE3E (Grade 11 Workplace discuss this option with your teacher and SERT).

# **GROUP 1:** [E.G. CGF, CGG, CHA, CIE, CLU, EMS, HFC, HNC, HPW, HSP]

1 additional credit in English, or French as a second language (FSL), or a Native language, or a Classical or International Language, or Social Sciences and the Humanities, or Canadian and World Studies, or cooperative Education (co-op)

# **GROUP 2:** [E.G. ADA, AMR, AMU, ASM, AVI, AWE, AWQ, BAF, BMI, PAF, PPL]

1 additional credit in Health and Physical Education, or the Arts, or Business studies, or French as a second language (FSL), or co-op

### **GROUP 3:** [E.G. ICS, SBI, SCH, SPH, TCJ, TDJ, TEL, TGJ, TTJ, TWJ, TXJ]

1 additional credit in Science, or Technological Education, or French as a second language (FSL), or Computer Studies, or co-op



ADA3O, Gr. 10 art or you must consult with your guidance counselor.



# **Math Considerations for Grade 11**




- Gr. 11 math is compulsory
- Based on post-secondary pathways, one or more Grade 12 math credits may be required for your future post-secondary plans.
- Research and select the appropriate Grade 11 math for Grade 12 requirements (e.g., MCF3M vs MCR3U).
- If you are unsure, discuss with your guidance counsellor.

# **Science Considerations for Grade 11**

- Grade 11 Science is not compulsory, however...
- Based on post-secondary pathways, Grade 12 science courses may be required.
- Ensure you have the appropriate Grade 11 courses for your Grade 12 requirements.
- If you are unsure, discuss with your guidance counsellor.











# **Cooperative Education (Co-op)**

# Why consider co-operative education?

ONTARIO OUTO PROGRAMME D'APPRENTISSAGE POUR LES JEUNES PROGRAM PROGRAM DE L'ONTARIO

- Hands-on real world work experience
- Add experience to your resume, cover letter and for future interviews
- Earn elective credits (including up to 2 group credits if needed)
- Refine post-secondary plans and career choices before beginning an apprenticeship, college or university
- Begin an apprenticeship through OYAP if interested in a skilled trade

## **Co-op process:**

- Select a 2 or 4 credit co-op in your high school planner
- Certain coop placements require a 4 credit co-op (e.g. construction placements such as electrical, carpentry etc)
- Participate in pre-placement meeting (you will be contacted by coop and invited to attend a mandatory meeting in the spring)
- Check the co-op intake Google classroom for further details

# **Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM)**

### What is SHSM?

- SHSM is NOT a course (there is no work, assignments, tests, summatives)
  - it is a program to help you plan for the future
- Assist students to focus on a career path matching skills and interests while meeting requirements of the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)

Earn an SHSM Red Seal on your OSSD



# Why you should consider SHSM?

- Focus education to suit interests, skills and learning needs
- Earn sector recognized certifications, training, and experiences (for FREE)
- Explore and refine career goals while building your resume and portfolio
- Appropriate for all pathways (apprenticeship, college, university, workplace)
- Fun experiences
- Eligibility for SHSM scholarships including at some post-secondary schools
- Bonus: free stuff (including SHSM t-shirt, hoodie and food)

# SHSM might be for you if you love...

- a. Field Trips to colleges, universities, trade centres, fairs, conferences etc
- **b. Training and Certifications** (e.g., Standard First Aid/CPR-C, WHMIS, infection control, leadership and others related to **your** sector)
- c. Engaging, fun and relevant educational experiences!
- d. FREE STUFF! (t-shirt, hoodie for grade 12 and even some food)



# **SHSM** application process:

- Select 2 or 4 credit co-op in your high school planner
- Sign up for SHSM even if you plan to take coop in your Grade 12 year)

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
# myBlueprint Graduation Indicator

### Find your skilled trade

The skilled trades are an exciting career choice and many are in high demand. Career paths in the skilled trades are full of potential, with more than 300 designated trades to choose from in Canada. Of those, 55 can have a **Red Seal Trade** designation. Generally, skilled tradespeople work in one of these sectors:



**Construction** is a multi-billion-dollar industry in Canada that offers high demand careers. It features electricians, carpenters, plumbers, steamfitters/pipefitter, welders, heavy equipment operators, and painters, among other trades.



**Transportation** includes maintenance and repair of vehicles - ranging from automobiles and motorcycles, to trucks and heavy equipment. Transportation includes trades such as automotive service technicians, heavyduty equipment technicians, motorcycle technicians, and more.



**Manufacturing and Industrial** features careers in many different manufacturing sectors, including automotive (parts and vehicle manufacturing), product manufacturing, and the resource extraction and processing industries. Manufacturing trades include tool and die makers, industrial mechanics (millwrights), metal fabricators, and more.



The **Services** sector is a major industry in the Canadian economy and includes cooks, bakers, hairstylists, landscape horticulturists, and more.



**Information and Digital Technology** skills are central to many trades including instrumentation and control technicians, machinists, and crane operators.





After selecting courses and alternates, select "Review Course Selection". Provides a final review before submitting.


This can trigger an "Alert" such as "selected less than the minimum requirement", "did not select full amount of alternates" etc.

## Final Steps for Course Selection



- After making final decisions... and after reviewing with your parents/guardians...
- → click submit between February 13 and 21, 2025
- Early submissions are accepted but course selection is <u>NOT</u> on a first come first serve basis.
- Hasty submissions will not be unlocked for corrections.
- Equal consideration for timetabling of courses will be given to students who meet the deadline.
