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Online Learning Graduation Requirement


- Students must either successfully complete 2 online (asynchronous) learning credits to earn an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD).

If you wish to opt out of the online graduation requirement, you must complete the opt-out option available on myBlueprint (with parent/guardian approval).







BEFORE PROCEEDING, NOTE CAREFULLY

NUMBER OF COURSES OVER OF AN ACADEMIC SCHOOL YEAR (SEP. - JUNE)

- An 80% average is required to be eligible to be on the The Honour Roll in at least 6 courses over the course of the school year taken only at MDHS (not earned at night school or private school)
- Students earning FEWER than 6 credits at MDHS will NOT be eligible to be on the Honour Roll.
- If you are taking 5 courses in day school and one course in night school, you are still NOT ELIGIBLE TO BE ON THE HONOUR ROLL.

ONTARIO SCHOLAR AND GRADUATION AWARDS

At High School:

- Ontario Scholars and Graduation Awards are High School graduates who attain an average of 80% or greater in their best 6 Grade 12 courses.
- All six courses must be grade 12 courses but can be calculated from different school years and from different schools <u>other</u> <u>than at MDHS.</u>

ENROLLED IN FEWER THAN 6 COURSES OVER THE COURSE OF A SCHOOL YEAR (SEP. - JUNE)

At University or College:

- Consequences of being a High School part time student for university or college:
- Please consult your post-secondary institution you have applied to.
- Check the <u>Ontario Universities Resource Guide</u> or <u>OntarioColleges.ca</u>.
- Some EXTERNAL scholarships you are applying for may only consider students
 with a full-time schedule in high school. Check the requirements for scholarships
 you apply for.

Individual Pathways Plan (IPP)

The IPP is the primary planning tool for students as they progress through school towards their initial post-secondary destination. (Creating Pathways to Success 2012)

Students will perform a four-step inquiry process performed from grades 7–12 based on four questions linked to four areas of learning. The web-based tool which will hold the IPP is myBlueprint.














STEP 4: To add courses to your High School Plan, clicking on a +Compulsory will take you directly to this subject area OR click on +Course to select from ALL course offerings




From +Course, a list of all subject disciplines will appear. Use the filter or the drop down arrows to reveal courses.





After selecting courses and alternates, select "Review Course Selection". Provides a final review before submitting.

This can trigger an "Alert" such as "selected less than the minimum requirement", "did not select full amount of alternates" etc.







Find your skilled trade

The skilled trades are an exciting career choice and many are in high demand. Career paths in the skilled trades are full of potential, with more than 300 designated trades to choose from in Canada. Of those, 55 can have a **Red Seal Trade** designation. Generally, skilled tradespeople work in one of these sectors:



Construction is a multi-billion-dollar industry in Canada that offers high demand careers. It features electricians, carpenters, plumbers, steamfitters/pipefitter, welders, heavy equipment operators, and painters, among other trades.



Transportation includes maintenance and repair of vehicles - ranging from automobiles and motorcycles, to trucks and heavy equipment. Transportation includes trades such as automotive service technicians, heavyduty equipment technicians, motorcycle technicians, and more.



Manufacturing and Industrial features careers in many different manufacturing sectors, including automotive (parts and vehicle manufacturing), product manufacturing, and the resource extraction and processing industries. Manufacturing trades include tool and die makers, industrial mechanics (millwrights), metal fabricators, and more.



The **Services** sector is a major industry in the Canadian economy and includes cooks, bakers, hairstylists, landscape horticulturists, and more.



Information and Digital Technology skills are central to many trades including instrumentation and control technicians, machinists, and crane operators.

Cooperative Education (Co-op)

Why consider co-operative education?

- Hands-on real world work experience
- Add to your resume, cover letter and supplemental applications
- Refine post-secondary plans and career choices
- Begin an apprenticeship through OYAP if interested in a skilled trade

Co-op process:

- Select a 2 or 4 credit co-op in your high school planner
- Certain coop placements require 4 credit co-op (e.g. construction placements such as electrical, carpentry etc)
- Participate in pre-placement meeting (you will be contacted by coop and invited to attend a mandatory meeting in the spring)

Please note:

- If you took coop last year you have already fulfilled that requirement
- If you are already in SHSM, you continue in SHSM in grade 12 and are able to participate in training and field trips that are offered next year!

Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM)

What is SHSM?

- SHSM is NOT a course (there is no work, assignments, tests, summatives)
 - it is a program to help you plan for the future
- Assist students to focus on a career path matching skills and interests while meeting requirements of the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)

Earn an SHSM Red Seal on your OSSD



Why you should consider SHSM?

- Focus education to suit interests, skills and learning needs
- Earn sector recognized certifications, training, and experiences (for FREE)
- Explore and refine career goals while building your resume and portfolio
- Appropriate for all pathways (apprenticeship, college, university, workplace)
- Fun experiences
- Eligibility for SHSM scholarships including at some post-secondary schools
- Bonus: free stuff (hoodie and food)

SHSM might be for you if you...

Do you love FREE?

- a. Field Trips to colleges, universities, trade centres, fairs, conferences etc
- **b. Training and Certifications** (e.g., Standard First Aid, CPR-C, WHMIS, customer service, infection control, leadership and others related to **your** sector)
- c. Engaging, fun and relevant educational experiences!
- d. FREE STUFF! (hoodie for grade 12 and even some food)

SHSM application process:

- Select 2 or 4 credit co-op in your high school planner
- Sign up for SHSM even if you plan to take coop in your Grade 12 year)




