# **Summer School**

# Summer school registration opened on April 9<sup>th</sup> in myBlueprint.

(Courses can be found under the "Continuing Education tab" on the left hand side of the dashboard.)

If your student is requesting a summer school course that they had planned to take next school year, their original selection will be replaced with one of their alternates. If your student is unable to complete their summer course, we will attempt to add this course to their timetable for next year. However, there is no guarantee that there will be a seat available in the original course selected.

Once registered, you <u>do NOT need</u> to print the sign off form that is provided. Students can only take <u>one</u> acceleration course during the summer session. Transportation is **not** provided for this program.

Students who were advised by their Guidance Counsellor to enroll in credit recovery based on their semester 1 final marks will also need to register as soon as possible. Please note, it is the student's responsibility to ensure they are registered for the appropriate course(s).

If students require assistance with the summer school registration process, please have them make an appointment with their alpha guidance counsellor.

#### **Acceleration Courses (18 days)**

- For students who wish to earn a credit in a subject they have not previously studied or those who wish to upgrade a mark in a course that they have successfully completed.
- Students are encouraged to register early to avoid disappointment.
- Course offerings are not guaranteed as they are based on enrollment and teacher availability.
- Students can only take **one** acceleration course during the summer session.
- Transportation is **not** provided for this program.

#### **Online Learning**

- Courses that are specifically designed to be taught in a fully online format.
- Online learning does not require pupils and teachers to be face-to-face with each other.
- Classes occur online using an asynchronous model, with check-in opportunities with the teacher.
- The learning platform is Brightspace by D2L.

Courses will be offered in a face-to-face learning model.

# STUDENTS 18+ YEARS OF AGE

#### **AGE OF CONSENT FORM**

When a child turns 18, they are legally considered an adult. With this change, ALL communication from the school, regarding your child will cease, AUTOMATICALLY, unless your child has completed, signed, and returned the Age of Consent Form. This form can be obtained from the Attendance Office. Failure to do so will mean that you will not receive ANY information from the school anymore including, but not limited to: information about your child's attendance and achievement, information about school closures, changes to the timetable or schedule, any information about Graduation (including the date and web address). It is imperative that if your child has turned 18 or will turn 18 before the end of this school year, they need to complete the Age of Consent Form. Teachers, Administration, and the school as a whole are unable to share any information with you if this has not been completed. The completed form is to be returned to the Main Office.
