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APPOINTMENTS

Students can make appointments online using Teach Assist.

- Have your child log in to their Teach Assist account
- Under the sub-heading “Appointment Bookings”
- Click on the day and time the student wants to have their appointment (if the appointment slot is highlighted in blue). If there are no appointments displayed, then you will have to select another day, as all counsellors have been booked for that day.
- You will see shaded in blue “All open appointments”. Choose the appropriate alpha Guidance counsellor (based on your child’s last name) from the list on the left.
- If the student needs to cancel their appointment for any reason, click “cancel”.
If your child has any trouble making their online appointment, please let us know.

Summer School

SUMMER SCHOOL REGISTRATION OPENS APRIL 15, 2025

How to Apply to Summer School at YRDSB

Students can register for summer school **My Pathway Planner (myBlueprint)**. On the Home Page, on the left hand side (Dashboard), click on "**Continuing Education**" and scroll down until you see "Online Summer Learning" or In-Person Learning.

If your student is requesting a summer school course that they had planned to take next school year, their original selection will be replaced with one of their alternates.

If your student is unable to complete their summer course, we will attempt to add this course to their timetable for next year. However, there is **no guarantee** that there will be a seat available in the original course selected.

Once registered, you **do NOT need** to print the sign off form that is provided. Students can only take **one** acceleration course during the summer session. Transportation is **not** provided for this program.

Students who were advised by their Guidance Counsellor to enroll in credit recovery based on their semester one final marks will also need to register as soon as possible. Please note, it is the student's responsibility to ensure they are registered for the appropriate course(s).

If students require assistance with the summer school registration process, please have them make an appointment with their alpha guidance counsellor.

Summer School (continued)

Online Summer Learning

Courses that are specifically designed to be taught in a fully online format. Online learning does not require pupils and teachers to be face-to-face with each other. Classes occur online using an asynchronous model, with check-in opportunities with the teacher. The learning platform is Brightspace by D2L.

Dates: Wednesday, July 2 to Friday, July 25

Hours: Flexible (6 hours per day minimum)

In-Person Learning

Courses will be offered in a face-to-face learning model.

Dates: Wednesday, July 2 to Friday, July 25

Hours: 8:45 am to 3:33 pm

Locations: Bill Hogarth SS, Bur Oak SS, Keswick HS, Maple HS, Middlefield CI, Newmarket HS, Richmond Green SS, and Thornlea SS

Note: Summer school in-person learning is NOT being offered at MDHS this year.

Students will NOT be approved for both platforms. Choose EITHER Online OR In-Person.

Credit Recovery/Differentiated Support

Timelines via Student Success memo registration forms. Registration with limited availability.

Dates: Session 1 - July 2 to 14 and/or Session 2 - July 15 to 25

Hours: 8:45 am to 3:33 pm

Reinforcement (9 days per session)

For students who have not successfully earned the credit and have achieved a mark between 35% and 49% with the recommendation of the home school Principal.

Dates: Session 1 - July 2 to 14 and/or Session 2 - July 15 to 25

Credit Strengthening (9 days per session)

Students who wish to upgrade their mark in credits they have previously earned.

Compulsory courses offered can be found in my Pathway Planner.

Students cannot take an acceleration course at the same time.

Program for Students with Developmental Delays (PSDD) / Multiple Exceptionalities (PSME)

Eligible Students: Designed for students who are currently being supported in a Developmental Disabilities or Multiple Exceptionalities classroom - ages 8 to 20.

Program Dates: July 7 - 25 (3 weeks), 9:00am - 3:10pm

Locations: Alexander Mackenzie HS, Dr. Denison SS, Keswick HS, Pierre Elliott Trudeau HS, Tommy Douglas SS, Unionville HS

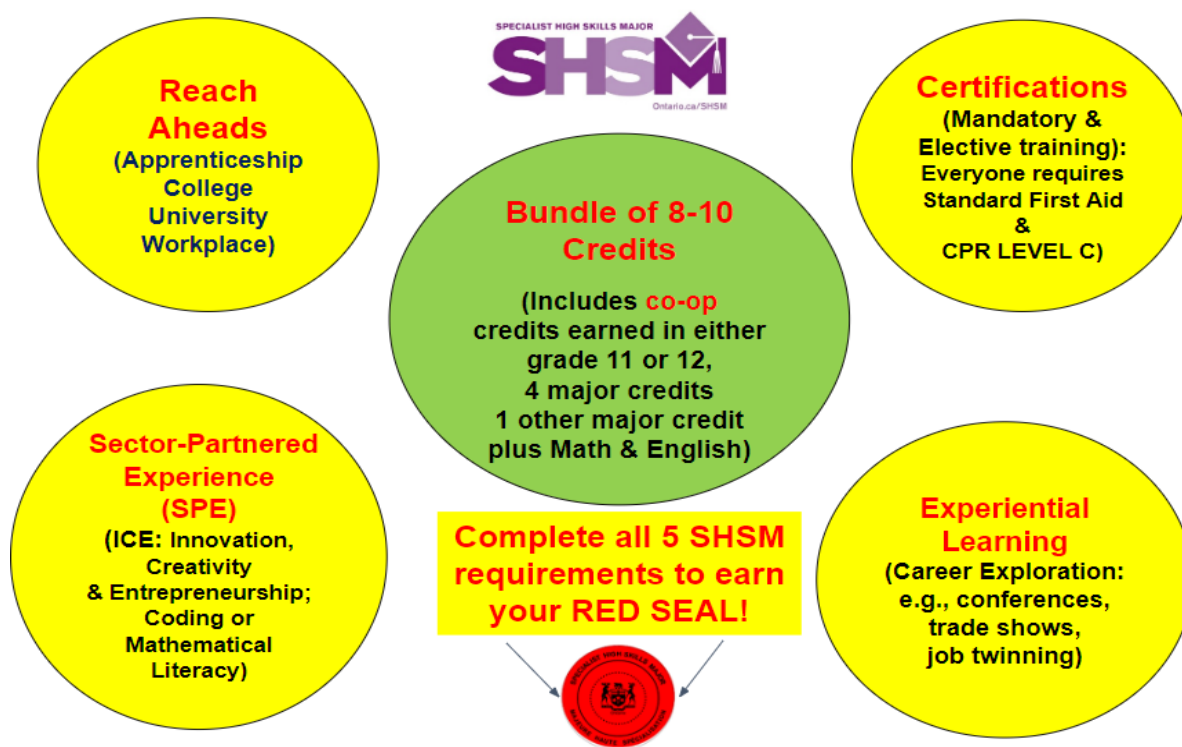
Students will receive a PDF once the application has been submitted. **Please print, and complete including with parent/guardian signatures and submit to Guidance.**

Why consider the Specialist High Skills Major program (SHSM)?

- ◆ Focus on a career path to match skills /interests, meeting Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) requirements
- ◆ Students **must** take cooperative education in grade 11 or 12 to be eligible.
- ◆ 2-year program for students entering grade 11 (students may register if entering grade 12 and plan on completing coop.)
- ◆ Customize secondary school education to suit interests and skills
- ◆ Complete sector recognized certifications (including Standard First Aid/CPR-C)
- ◆ Prepare for post-secondary opportunities
- ◆ Earn the SHSM Distinction on the OSSD
- ◆ Engage in fun, experiential learning with like-minded peers
- ◆ Participation in training and field trips is **free for SHSM students.**

Internationally touring exhibition, created by Musealia, co-produced by the Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial and Museum in Poland, and developed with an international panel of curators and historians, One of the most comprehensive exhibitions ever presented on the subject and ROM is the only Canadian stop on its international tour.
