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APPOINTMENTS

Students can make appointments online using Teach Assist.

- Have your child log in to their Teach Assist account
- Under the sub-heading "Appointment Bookings"
- Click on the day and time the student wants to have their appointment (if the appointment slot is highlighted in blue). If there are no appointments displayed, then you will have to select another day, as all counsellors have been booked for that day.
- You will see shaded in blue "All open appointments". Choose the appropriate alpha Guidance counsellor (based on your child's last name) from the list on the left.
- If the student needs to cancel their appointment for any reason, click "cancel". If your child has any trouble making their online appointment, please let us know.

Summer School — Registration opened April 15, 2025

How to Apply to Summer School at YRDSB

Students can register for summer school **My Pathway Planner (myBlueprint)**. On the Home Page, on the left hand side (Dashboard), click on "**Continuing Education**" and scroll down until you see "Online Summer Learning" or In-Person Learning.

If your student is requesting a summer school course that they had planned to take next school year, their original selection will be replaced with one of their alternates.

If your student is unable to complete their summer course, we will attempt to add this course to their timetable for next year. However, there is **no guarantee** that there will be a seat available in the original course selected.

Once registered, you <u>do NOT need</u> to print the sign off form that is provided. Students can only take <u>one</u> acceleration course during the summer session. Transportation is **not** provided for this program.

Students who were advised by their Guidance Counsellor to enroll in credit recovery based on their semester one final marks will also need to register as soon as possible. Please note, it is the student's responsibility to ensure they are registered for the appropriate course(s).

If students require assistance with the summer school registration process, please have them make an appointment with their alpha guidance counsellor.

Online Summer Learning

Courses that are specifically designed to be taught in a fully online format. Online learning does not require pupils and teachers to be face-to-face with each other. Classes occur online using an asynchronous model, with check-in opportunities with the teacher. The learning platform is Brightspace by D2L.

In-Person Learning

Courses will be offered in a face-to-face learning model.

<u>Note</u>: Summer school in-person learning is NOT being offered at MDHS this year.

Students will NOT be approved for both platforms. Choose EITHER Online OR In-Person.

Credit Recovery / Differentiated Support

Timelines via Student Success memo registration forms. Registration with limited availability.

Dates: Session 1 - July 2 to 14 and/or Session 2 - July 15 to 25

Hours: 8:45 am to 3:33 pm

Reinforcement (9 days per session)

For students who have not successfully earned the credit and have achieved a mark between 35% and 49% with the recommendation of the home school Principal.

IMPORTANT DATES for UNIVERSITY APPLICANTS

May 29 – Deadline for universities to make an offer admission, refusal or deferral

- June 2 The earliest date a current Ontario high school student may be required to respond to an Ontario university offer of admission and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.). School-specific deadlines for students to make a financial commitment (deposit for tuition and/or residence) to their chosen university
- June 4 Students who did not receive an offer of admission may begin to use the AIS system to search available programs (see your Counsellor for details)

IMPORTANT DATES for COLLEGE APPLICANTS

May 1Deadline to Confirm Offers of Admission — Applicants must confirm their acceptance of an offer of
admission by this date. Log in to your ontariocolleges.ca account to confirm your offer.

Colleges may extend offers of admission after this date. Each college will set the deadline to confirm offers made after May 1st and this deadline will be communicated to you with your offer.

JuneTuition Deposit Due at the Colleges— The colleges require payment of a tuition deposit in June to
secure your spot in your program. Each college sets its own tuition deposit amount and payment
deadline. This information will be communicated to you by the college.

Students will receive a PDF once the application has been submitted. **Please print**, and **complete** including **with parent/guardian signatures** and **submit to Guidance**.

Why consider the Specialist High Skills Major program (SHSM)?

- Focus on a career path to match skills /interests, meeting Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) requirements
- Students **must** take cooperative education in grade 11 or 12 to be eligible.
- 2-year program for students entering grade 11 (students may register if entering grade 12 and plan on completing coop.)
- Customize secondary school education to suit interests and skills
- Complete sector recognized certifications (including Standard First AID/CPR-C)
- Prepare for post-secondary opportunities
- Earn the SHSM Distinction on the OSSD
- Engage in fun, experiential learning with like-minded peers
- Participation in training and field trips is free for SHSM students.
