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APPOINTMENTS

Students can make appointments online using Teach Assist.

- Have your child log in to their Teach Assist account
- Under the sub-heading "Appointment Bookings"
- Click on the day and time the student wants to have their appointment (if the appointment slot is highlighted in blue). If there are no appointments displayed, then you will have to select another day, as all counsellors have been booked for that day.
- You will see shaded in blue "All open appointments". Choose the appropriate alpha Guidance counsellor (based on your child's last name) from the list on the left.
- If the student needs to cancel their appointment for any reason, click "cancel".
 If your child has any trouble making their online appointment, please let us know.

The OUAC/OCAS transmission will occur on Thursday, November 23rd. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that their OUAC/OCAS account has accurate educational information which includes their mid-term marks. MDHS is not responsible for transmitting marks received outside of YRDSB. If you have any questions or concerns regarding your transmitted marks, please contact your alpha Counsellor.

MDHS Guidance goes Trading

On Wednesday, November 15, MDHS took 45 students to the International Centre to Level Up (sponsored by Skilled Trades Ontario)!

This dynamic fair that brought together many skilled trades professionals across industry organizations, post-secondary institutions, businesses and associations. Students had an opportunity to learn about Ontario's 140+ trades through interactive exhibitions and hands-on activities, while networking with tradespeople and local employers. Quick facts for the skilled trades:

1 in 6 job openings are projected to be in the skilled trades by 2026

85 to 90% of an apprenticeship is paid, on-the-job training

24,600 employers offer paid apprenticeships

1.3 million people are working in skilled trades-related occupations in Ontario.

At least one in three workers in Ontario with an apprenticeship or trade certificate is aged 55 or over and nearing retirement.

In total, there were 91,634 apprentices active in Ontario as of April 3, 2023
