# **Post-Secondary Information**

#### **IMPORTANT DATES for UNIVERSITY APPLICANTS**

- May 29 Deadline for universities to make an offer admission, refusal or deferral
- June 3 The earliest date a current Ontario high school student may be required to respond to an Ontario university offer of admission and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.). School-specific deadlines for students to make a financial commitment (deposit for tuition and/or residence) to their chosen university
- June 5 Students who did not receive an offer of admission may begin to use the AIS system to search available programs (see your Counsellor for details)

#### **IMPORTANT DATES for COLLEGE APPLICANTS**

#### June 2024: Tuition Deposit Due at the Colleges —

The colleges require payment of a tuition deposit in June to secure your spot in your program. Each college sets its own tuition deposit amount and payment deadline. This information will be communicated to you by the college.

#### **Summer School**

### Summer school registration opened on April 9th in myBlueprint

(Courses can be found under the "Continuing Education tab" on the left hand side of the dashboard.)

# **Deadline to apply is June 7<sup>th</sup> for Acceleration Courses**

If your student is requesting a summer school course that they had planned to take next school year, their original selection will be replaced with one of their alternates. If your student is unable to complete their summer course, we will attempt to add this course to their timetable for next year. However, there is <u>no guarantee</u> that there will be a seat available in the original course selected.

Once registered, you <u>do NOT need</u> to print the sign off form that is provided. Students can only take <u>one</u> acceleration course during the summer session. Transportation is **not** provided for this program.

Students who were advised by their Guidance Counsellor to enroll in credit recovery based on their semester 1 final marks will also need to register as soon as possible. Please note, it is the student's responsibility to ensure they are registered for the appropriate course(s).

If students require assistance with the summer school registration process, please have them make an appointment with their alpha guidance counsellor.

#### <u>Summer School Reinforcement</u> (for students who were recommended for credit recovery)

- Session 1 for reinforcement courses start Wednesday, July 3 and end Monday, July 15.
   Session 2 for reinforcement courses start Tuesday, July 16 and end Friday, July 26.
- \*\*\* Students selecting Civics/Careers in summer school MUST select both unless they have previously earned either of these half credits. The session order does not matter. \*\*\*

#### Acceleration Courses (18 days)

- For students who wish to earn a credit in a subject they have not previously studied or those who wish to upgrade a mark in a course that they have successfully completed.
- Students are encouraged to register early to avoid disappointment.
- Course offerings are not guaranteed as they are based on enrollment and teacher availability.
- Students can only take **one** acceleration course during the summer session.
- Transportation is **not** provided for this program.

#### **Online Learning**

- Courses that are specifically designed to be taught in a fully online format.
- Online learning does not require pupils and teachers to be face-to-face with each other.
- Classes occur online using an asynchronous model, with check-in opportunities with the teacher.
- The learning platform is Brightspace by D2L.

Dates: Tuesday, July 2 to Thursday, July 25 Hours: Flexible (6 hours per day minimum)

#### **In-Person Learning**

Courses will be offered in a face-to-face learning model.

**Dates:** Wednesday, July 3 to Friday, July 26 Hours: 8:45 am to 3:33 pm

# UOFT SUMMER PSYCHOLOGY RESEARCH INITIATIVE



# Are you a high school student in Ontario who is interested in psychology and research? Join us at SPRINT 2024!

The University of Toronto **Summer Psychology Research Initiative (SPRINT)** is a free summer program for high school students in Ontario to learn about a broad range of psychology topics and gain research experience.

As a program committed to promoting equity, diversity, and inclusivity, applicants who identify as **Black**, **Indigenous**, **and People of Colour and/or members of other historically underrepresented social groups** (e.g., first-generation students) will be prioritized in the selection process. In addition, SPRINT prioritizes upper-year high school students (i.e., entering grades 11 and 12), recent high school graduates, and former SPRINT applicants who were not previously selected.

This year, SPRINT will be held between **July 15–26, 2024, Monday - Friday, in person at the University of Toronto, St. George Campus**. Students will be selected into one of two program streams based on their interests and goals.
