APPOINTMENTS

Students can make appointments online using Teach Assist.

- Have your child log in to their Teach Assist account.
- Under the sub-heading "Appointment Bookings" .
- Click on the day and time the student wants to have their appointment (if the appointment slot is highlighted in blue). If there are no appointments displayed, then you will have to select another day, as all counsellors have been booked for that day.
- You will see shaded in blue "All open appointments". Choose the appropriate alpha Guidance counsellor (based on your child's last name) from the list on the left.
- If the student needs to cancel their appointment for any reason, click "cancel".

SCHULICH LEADERS SCHOLARSHIP

Due: January 12th, 2023 (2:35pm)

Deadline for application to be received in Guidance or emailed to gabrielle.mcgill @yrdsb.ca (for school sponsorship consideration). The application can be found on the Scholarship Google Classroom.

Nominees must possess at least two of three criteria:

- Academic Excellence
- Leadership (community, business or entrepreneurial)
- Students with a strong financial need will be given a strong consideration

Application for consideration requires:

- Universities where the Nominee wants to attend
- List of top three achievements (academic or other)
- 600 word essay demonstrating why they would make a great Schulich Leader
- Optional 250 word essay to outline extenuating circumstances

The Student who is nominated will have their name submitted by January 31, 2023.

They will then receive an email directly from the Schulich Leaders Scholarship to complete the full application (including letters of reference and all other requested materials), by the requested due date of February 21st, 2023.

- ♦ If you have already applied to be in the program, you do NOT need to reapply.

Night School Credit Courses

SEMESTER TWO (Winter 2023) ***Winter registration will open in January 2023***

Session runs from February 16, 2023 to June 8, 2023

Please note: We encourage students to register early as course offerings are not guaranteed and are subject to sufficient enrollment and teacher availability.

- ◆ Traditional in class face-to-face Night School program will move to a remote learning delivery model. The program will be delivered virtually in real-time (synchronous). Classes are held on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:30-9:45 p.m.
- Before the start of the program, students will receive an email with instructions on how to join the class on the first day. YRDSB students will log in with their gapps accounts and non-YRDSB students will be provided with different instructions that will be sent to the email address provided on their registration form.

Community Involvement/Volunteering

The community involvement graduation requirement of a minimum of **40 hours** has been restored for the 2022-2023 school year.

At the principal's discretion, students could earn hours during the time allotted for the instructional program on a school day, and through duties normally performed in the home. This can include helping an elderly relative with an errand or a sibling with homework. Additionally, students could count a maximum of 10 hours from paid employment for students aged 14 years and older. These flexible measures will continue to be available for the 2022-23 school year for all students.

Here are the steps you must follow in order to ensure your hours are approved.

- Step 1: Review the list of eligible activities as set out on the YRDSB website.
- Step 2: Select an activity. Students may want to contact one or more of the following charitable organizations; community agencies · community centers · government offices · service clubs · volunteer centers
- Step 3: Complete the notification portion of the Notification and Completion of Community Involvement Activities Form by contacting your Guidance Counsellor to discuss via email or by making an appointment on TeachAssist. (https://www2.yrdsb.ca/sites/default/files/migrate/files/FOR-communityinvolvement.pdf)

Contact your guidance counsellor if you are unsure if your activity will count. In the event that you do not discuss the volunteer activity with your guidance counsellor, then you run the risk of your hours not counting.

- Step 4: Complete your volunteer activities
- Step 5: Submit the completed form. Ensure that all sections are completed, including parent signature, supervisor name, title and contact details. Then submit the completed form to Guidance.
