#### **APPOINTMENTS**

Students can make appointments online using Teach Assist.

- Have your child log in to their Teach Assist account.
- Under the sub-heading "Appointment Bookings".
- Click on the day and time the student wants to have their appointment (if the appointment slot is highlighted in blue). If there are no appointments displayed, then you will have to select another day, as all counsellors have been booked for that day.
- You will see shaded in blue "All open appointments". Choose the appropriate alpha Guidance counsellor (based on your child's last name) from the list on the left.
- If the student needs to cancel their appointment for any reason, click "cancel".

# **Night School**

#### SEMESTER 2 REMOTE LEARNING NIGHT SCHOOL (Winter 2023)

Attention students who want to register for Night School in Semester 2. Winter registration is now open using My Pathway Planner, and courses will run from **February 16, 2023 to June 8, 2023**.

Please be advised that traditional in class **face-to-face** Night School program will move to a remote learning delivery model. The program will be delivered virtually in **real-time** (**synchronous**). Classes will be held on **Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:30 pm to 9:45 pm.** We encourage students to register early as course offerings are not guaranteed and are subject to sufficient enrollment.

#### SEMESTER 2 ONLINE LEARNING NIGHT SCHOOL (Winter 2023)

Winter 2023 courses run from February 21- June 5, 2023.

Current YRDSB Student registration period: January 31 - February 28, 2023 using My Pathway Planner.

Online Learning (formerly referred to as "e-learning") provides students with another option to expand their educational experience. The program offers courses that are specifically designed to be taught in a fully online format. Classes occur online using an **asynchronous model**, with numerous synchronous learning opportunities offered with the teacher.

Students can expect to do a minimum of 6 hours of learning each week per course. The program offers courses that are specifically designed to be taught in a **fully online format** (formerly referred to as "e-learning").

Online learning relies on communication between pupils and teachers. Online learning does not require pupils and teachers to be face-to-face with each other.

Appropriate for all pathways (apprenticeship, college, university and workplace)

Arts & Culture: (careers ranging from animator to writer)

Construction (careers ranging from architect to welder)

Health & Wellness (careers ranging from athletic trainer to zoologist)

Horticulture & Landscaping (careers ranging from agricultural technician to wetland biologist)

Non-Profit (careers ranging from administrative officer to women's shelter director)

Transportation (careers ranging from auto mechanic to water transportation manager)

\*\*\*Please note, there are many other careers that fall into the various sectors above.

**Reminder:** Grade 12 SHSM students should check that they are on track to earn their Red Seal. Earning your SHSM Red Seal may make you eligible for a post-secondary scholarship along with the many other benefits of completing the various components.

#### **CERTIFICATIONS / REACH AHEADS and EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING:**

If you earned certificates outside of school (e.g., St. John's Babysitting, Standard First AID/CPR Level C, leadership, customer service, etc), please use the self-reporting link in the student SHSM site so that you can have these added to your SHSM record card. This also applies to reach ahead and experiential learning activities.

#### **SHSM REGISTRATION**

- Grade 11 students interested in registering for SHSM who are in co-op this year (or who are planning to take coop in grade 12) are encouraged to register for SHSM using the information below.
- If you are in grade 12 and either took coop last year or are taking it this year, you may still be eligible for SHSM provided that you are able to meet the requirements of the program.
- ♦ If you have already applied to be in the program, you do NOT need to reapply.
