Ready to explore your future with Ontario community colleges? In just four sessions, you will be able to meet with representatives from all Ontario community colleges.

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Community Involvement/Volunteering

This applies to grade 12 students graduating only.

In 2021-22, the required number of hours for community involvement activities will be reduced from 40 hours to a minimum of **20** hours for graduating students. This is consistent with changes made in the 2020-21 school year.

Applies to all grades 9-12.

At the principal's discretion, the following activities will be deemed eligible for all secondary students for their community involvement activities in the 2021-22 school year:

- ⇒ Activities such as walking a younger neighbour or sibling to and from school, helping younger siblings with their homework, helping elderly relatives with errands, providing after-school care for a younger sibling etc. up to a maximum of **10 hours.**
- ⇒ Activities that include up to 10 hours of paid work, with the requirement to complete a reflection exercise indicating how their work contributed to service for others (e.g., grocery work during the pandemic)

Here are the steps you must follow in order to ensure your hours are approved.

- Step 1: Review the list of eligible activities as set out on the YRDSB website.
- Step 2: Select an activity. Students may want to contact one or more of the following charitable organizations; community agencies · community centers · government offices · service clubs · volunteer centers
- Step 3: Complete the notification portion of the Notification and Completion of Community Involvement Activities Form by contacting your Guidance Counsellor to discuss via email or by making an appointment on TeachAssist.

Contact your guidance counsellor if you are unsure if your activity will count. In the event that you do not discuss the volunteer activity with your Guidance Counsellor, then you run the risk of your hours not counting.

- Step 4: Complete your volunteer activities
- Step 5: Submit the completed form. Ensure that all sections are completed, including parent signature, supervisor name, title and contact details. Then submit the completed form to Guidance.

SHSM SECTORS at MDHS

Appropriate for all pathways (apprenticeship, college, university and workplace)

Arts & Culture: Construction Health & Wellness Horticulture & Landscaping Non-Profit Transportation (careers ranging from artist to writer) (careers ranging from architect to welder) (careers ranging from biomedical engineer to veterinarian) (careers ranging from agricultural technician to wetland biologist) (careers ranging from administrative officer to social services) (careers ranging from auto mechanic to urban planner)

***Please note, there are many other careers that fall into the various sectors above.

Reminder: Grade 12 SHSM students should check that they are on track to earn their Red Seal.

***If you are missing a certification (e.g. Working at Heights for Construction, Standard First AID/CPR Level C – offered as an awareness course this year and last year due to COVID restrictions), there will be opportunities to earn them. If you are missing other SHSM requirements (e.g. courses, Reach Aheads, Experiential Learning), inquire on the MDHS SHSM students site to see how you may be able to complete these requirements.

CERTIFICATIONS / REACH AHEADS and EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING:

If you have earned certificates outside of school (e.g. St. John's Babysitting, Standard First AID/CPR Level C, Leadership, customer service, or others), please use the self-reporting link in the student SHSM site so that you can earn credit. This can also be used for Reach Ahead and Experiential Learning activities completed by you.
