### Kindergarten Registration

Kindergarten registration has begun for the 2016-17 school year. Children born in 2012 are eligible for junior kindergarten this September 2016. Children born in 2011 and are currently attending public school are eligible for senior kindergarten in September 2016.

Proof of child's age - Birth Certificate, if born in Canada.

- Passport, Permanent Resident Card of the child and parents if child is born outside of Canada.

If you rent:



YMCA Before and Aftercare Programs are available at all locations.





Modern learning is authentic, relevant, deep learning that enables learners to create, to connect, to communicate and to share their learning with the world and to be future ready. At Markham Gateway, we are committed to empowering our students through modern learning.

We are excited to inform our school community that we are in the process of creating a permanent MakerSpace for our students in the Learning Commons (Library). A MakerSpace is a collaborative learning environment where students come together to explore, create, and innovate as well as share their passions, information, ideas, successes, failures, and new skills. In a MakerSpace, learning is hands-on, experiential, student-driven, and inquiry based. The creation of this new learning environment aligns with our school improvement plan and supports the York Region District School Board's three main priorities for improvements in student achievement and well-being through modern learning, mathematics, and mental health and well-being.

While the activities in the MakerSpace will evolve over time, we will begin with robotics, computer coding, virtual field trips via Google Expeditions, toy hacking, green screening, Lego construction and building from recycled materials.

To create this space, we require some support. Over the next two weeks, we are asking families to donate new and/or gently used materials you may have at home that are no longer being used. The materials we require include:

- Small toys regular and battery-powered (e.g., Hot Wheel cars, transportation toys)
- Building materials Lego, Tinker Toys, Knex, blocks, etc.
- Craft supplies Tape, googly eyes, ribbon, string, fabric, pipe cleaners, etc.
- Recyclable materials plastic juice and yogurt containers, paper towel rolls, water bottles and caps, cardboard, clear plastic sheets - from etc.

Please have your child drop off their donated materials in the labelled bin(s) located outside the Learning Commons by Wednesday, April 20th.
