March was an exciting month at Markham Gateway! Students and staff were busy with many new events and special experiences that were planned. As part of the **YRDSB** Foundational Practices of Equity, Leadership and Innovation, students and staff led initiatives which focused on raising awareness of Human Rights, with recognition, appreciation and respect for our culturally diverse community. Innovative learning experiences helped students explore important themes of acceptance, equity and antidiscrimination, as represented by the cultural mosaic of our community of learners and community partners who visited the school.

Early in March, we hosted students and special guests from Milliken Mills P.S. who performed at the Lunar New Year Assembly, followed by learning stations. All classes visited these various stations, participating in Martial Arts, Paper Design and Origami, Calligraphy. Finally, each class had a class picture taken at the photo booth. Before we closed for March break, students, staff and community celebrated Black History, Heritage and Culture with an assembly and a "Move-a-thon". Special Guest, Ms. Josette Leader taught everyone about the history of the steelpan and the evolution of steelpan music today. Students reflected on the important messages from Martin Luther King Jr. and Nelson Mandela, followed by poetry from Maya Angelou. They learned about the resilience and perseverance of leaders such as Harriet Tubman and were inspired by her "Dreamer" quote. The assembly wrapped up to the

beat of D.J. Joshua who played global sounds and took everyone on a "Global Rhythmic Tour"!

To further our learning of Equity as a foundational practice, we brought in a display and presentation to promote Culturally Relevant Pedagogy and Resources to our Learning Commons. This was set up with 2 TV Monitors (English & Tamil) to show the ancient legend of Ponnivala, produced by Dr. Brenda Beck, Associate Professor of UFT. The Legend of Ponnivala is a story that traces back to ancient India, and follows one family, through three generations Students all took turns visiting the Learning Commons with the classmates to attend a presentation by Dr. Beck. She talked about cultural identity, universal themes, cross -curricular connections and rich critical inquiry to support critical thinking, and promote personal connections. Finally, students presented classical arts and culture in the Tamil Heritage assembly.

We were proud to host two dynamic events which wrapped up the month of March. The International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination was a collaboration between staff and students of Markham Gateway P.S., Milliken Mills P.S., Cedar- engagement for our school commuwood P.S., and E.T.Crowle P.S. This nity. We remind families to slow event was attended by many Community leaders and Advocates for Social Justice. YRDBS Director Parappally attended with Superintendent Erik Khilji, and both brought greetings and perspectives on Equity, Innovation and Leadership in their respective messages to the audience and school community. Deputy Mayor Heath brought greetings from the Markham City Council. Important themes and concepts of Social Justice were at the forefront of critical inquiry on Human Rights.

Students understood the significance of human rights in everyday work and play, and have become strong advocates for social change, equity and inclusion. Students paid tribute to First Nations, Metis and Inuit communities by launching our "Ribbons of Reconciliation" Campaign, in honor of the survivors of the Residential School System in Canada. They pledged to work and advocate for a changing society served by foundational, universal values. Students and staff are excited to continue this journey of inquiry, learning and advocacy.

The second event, "Family Math Night" was coordinated to share valuable strategies on how families can organize math games, puzzles and problem solving in their homes. Stations were set up around the school and families participated in various stations. The event was a great success, and now many students and their families will enjoy learning math at home, and spend time thinking about and solving problems. Student leaders facilitated the sessions with staff, and all families were inspired to practice the games and math strategies in their homes.

April will bring rich new learning and down when driving into the drop off area in the morning and afternoon. Students are also reminded to get to their pick -up area as soon as possible after the bell rings in the afternoon.



### Kindergarten Registration

Kindergarten registration has begun for the 2017-18 school year. Children born in 2013 are eligible for Year 1 kindergarten this September 2017. Children born in 2012 and are currently attending public school are eligible for Year 2 kindergarten in September 2017.

#### Documents that are required for registration are as follows:

Proof of child's age - Birth Certificate, if born in Canada.

- Passport, Permanent Resident Card of the child and parents if child is born outside of Canada.

# **FOREST OF READING**

### Dear Families,

We are very excited that our school has been once again participating in the *Forest of Reading 2017* program, which is Canada's largest recreational reading program for children and youth! *Forest of Reading* is a voluntary reading program which is designed to promote reading for enjoyment and to increase awareness of quality Canadian literature.


This is how the program works: for each age group (K-2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8) there is a set of ten books (fiction and non-fiction) written by Canadian authors. Readers must *read a minimum of five books from February to April* to be eligible to vote for their favourite book. They may read their books independently, with a family member or a friend. At the end of April, readers will vote for their favourite Canadian title. Based on voting across the country, the most favourite book will be announced and the author will be honoured with a special award at the Festival of Trees!

The various Forest *of Reading* programs that MGPS has been participating in are: **Blue Spruce** (Kindergarten to Grade 2), **Silver Birch Express** (Grades 3 and 4), **Silver Birch Fiction and Non-Fiction** (Grades 5 and 6), and **Red Maple Fiction and Non-Fiction** (Grades 7 and 8). All Kindergarten to Grade 2 students are involved (total of about 160 students) and in Grades 3 to 8 there are over 100 participants who have taken the initiative to join! For K-2, each picture book will be read aloud to their class by different staff members, which we call Guest Readers (administration, teachers, support staff, etc.). There are also many Guest Readers throughout the school who have read the books in the Silver Birch and Red Maple programs. They have made themselves available to ask the students questions about the books they have read and sign their tracking sheets.
