Did you know...

"Thirteen percent of Canadians live in a state of food insecurity, which means they do not have reliable access to adequate amounts of safe, good-quality, nutritious food. The root cause of hunger in Canada is low income, which consistently affects more than four million of us at any given time. Food banks are an important method of addressing this need. Each month, over 850,000 people turn to food banks for help; more than one-third are children and youth. The people who visit food banks come from all backgrounds. They include families with children, employed people whose low wages do not cover basic living essentials, individuals on social assistance, and Canadians living on a fixed income, including seniors and people with disabilities."

Positive Parenting TIP



As the weather starts to get colder, it's natural to want to bundle up and stay indoors but according to the 2015 ParticipACTION Report Card on Physical Activity for Children and Youth, the biggest risk to our children's health and well-being just might be keeping them bundled up inside!

After conducting two systematic reviews of the best available scientific research, the Healthy Active Living and Obesity Research Group at the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario along with 13 other organizations concluded that:

- "Children who engage in active outdoor play in natural environments demonstrate resilience, self-regulation and develop skills for dealing with stress later in life."
- "Outdoor play that occurs in minimally structured, free and accessible environments facilitates socialization with peers, the community and the environment, reduces feelings of isolation, builds inter-personal skills and facilitates healthy development."
