Message from the Administration

Dear Markham Gateway Families,

It is hard to believe that we have reached the halfway point of the school year. As we transition to Term Two, teachers will be providing an assessment update to students and parents through the distribution of the First Provincial Report Card which will be sent home on February 18. These reports, as outlined in the Ministry of Education's *Growing Success* Policy, reflect student learning to date. Please note that student achievement of curriculum expectations, as well as learning skills, will be included on the report card. Teachers will also be sharing next steps for learning for each child to assist students, parents and teachers in working collaboratively to improve student achievement. We ask that you take the time to discuss the report card with your child(ren) in order to plan effectively for the second term of the school year. Please do not hesitate to contact your child(ren)'s teacher for any further clarification or guidance.

The staff at Markham Gateway Public School continues to work with students and community members to provide a rich and engaging program of learning for the students at our school. In addition to having high expectations for student learning in classrooms, many other exciting initiatives continue to be embedded in the life of our school to provide a broad experience for all of our students. These include: school teams such as basketball and volleyball, chess team, Environmental Club, Choir, Guitar Ensemble, Student Council, Me to We, and assorted intramural activities. We also take time each month to come together as a school community during our monthly Character and Recognition assemblies. A schedule of these assemblies is contained in this newsletter and we invite and encourage all parents who are able to attend any or all of these assemblies.

Our winter weather this year has been unusual and unpredictable. Although we have had very little snow, this may change at any time. We ask for parent support by ensuring students have appropriate and sufficient clothing to keep them warm and dry when we are outside during recess and lunch. Unless it is extremely cold or dangerous due to icy conditions, we will be outside during recess and lunch. In addition, please partner with us by reminding your children that snow cannot be thrown at other people and to respect the snow creations of other students. It is important that everyone recognize and accept that in order to ensure everyone's safety, we cannot allow snowball throwing at school.

We realize that traffic and pedestrian safety is an often repeated message in our newsletter but it is critical that EVERYONE follow the rules of the road and parking lot. The winter weather usually brings about an increase in the number of cars we have entering our parking lot and drop off area. Please remember that safety ALWAYS comes before convenience. Drivers need to be patient when entering and exiting the drop off area at the front of the school. Please remember that the drop off area is similar to what is commonly referred to as a Kiss N Ride process. Drivers should never be parking or leaving their vehicles in the drop off zone. If you need to leave your car for any reason, you must park in the parking lot. We have a lot of cars entering and exiting our parking lot each morning and afternoon. Please continue to be patient and observe signage and the direction of staff and we will continue to ensure a safe start and finish to our school day for everyone.

FOOD ALLERGIES and CELEBRATION TREATS

In our school community, we have students with severe and life-threatening allergies. While nut/peanut allergies are the most known allergens, other common allergies are to shellfish, seeds, berries, insect bites, dairy (milk, eggs) and others. We also have numerous students with faith-based, dietary and health related food requirements.

In order to keep all our students safe from allergens, as well as to accommodate for dietary needs, we strongly ask you to **avoid sending any food that is not for your own child.** Peanut and nut products should not be sent to school. Please ensure that you check labels carefully.

When celebrating special occasions, **please do not send food items.** Stickers, pencils, and erasers are examples of acceptable alternatives.

Thank you for your understanding and continued support of our students and staff who have life-threatening allergies.



Kindergarten Registration

Passion to Give Fashion





2015 Spring World Classroom Program (for students and their families)

International Education Services (IES) of the York Region District School Board helps students from other countries in the world (we call them "international students") attend our schools and live with local families in York Region. The reason international students choose to come here is to improve their English and learn about our culture and our country.

We have an amazing opportunity for you and your family to participate in as hundreds of other York Region students and their families have in the past several years.

This Spring (tentatively April 10 to May 23), a group of 25 students from the Shanghai Xiawai International School are coming to several schools in York Region. The visiting students need to live with a local family who have children that attend a YRDSB elementary school. What we do is match a visiting Chinese student to a York Region family/student. The Chinese visitor will live with the local family and they will go to school together for about six weeks, go on two excursions with the whole group, and attend a World Classroom party. Families who host a visiting student **receive \$225 per week** to cover the cost of hosting the student.

By sharing your home, family and school with your visitor from China, you will also get to learn about their culture and country... and maybe even learn a little bit of Mandarin or Shanhainese!

If you and your family are adventurous, like to meet interesting people and learn about new places and cultures, we encourage you to talk to your family about applying to host a student.

The application must be completed by your parents and returned to your Principal for approval no later than **March 5th**. Your Principal will then send the application to our team for consideration.

	Now that you have heard about this exciting opportunity, please share the
	information with your parents and family! When your parents and family have agreed to host an international student, please complete the attached World Classroom Application and give it to your Teacher as soon as possible! Applications should be submitted no later than February 27. After your Principal approves your application, it will be sent to us (International
	Education Services) for consideration. When we have received enough applications, we will review them and may contact your family to set up a visit in your home with a Homestay Representative to interview you and your family and talk about the program. When visiting your home, the Homestay Representative will take pictures of your home and family, and prepare a host family profile using the information you share during the visit. The pictures and profile are sent to partners once matching is completed and if you are assigned a partner. If approved, your family will be instructed to proceed with Police Vulnerable Sector Screening (PVSC) which is mandatory for participation in this program. This means that anyone in your family who is 18 years or older must complete PVSC in time for hosting a student. There is a small \$20 volunteer fee applicable for PVSC completion.
	After interviews are completed, we will review all of the applications and match partners as best we can by age, gender, interests, hobbies and other family/partner information. This process can take a few weeks. Once matching is done, and if you are matched with a partner, we will contact your family to let you know the good news! Only applicants who are matched will be contacted. We do our best to match everyone who applies, but sometimes, if we receive a large number of applications, not everyone in able to have a partner.
	applications, not everyone is able to have a partner. If you are matched with a partner, we will email important program information to you and your family. It is important that you or your parents check email every day. This information will include a profile and picture of your partner, a program itinerary and calendar with details about all the fun activities you will participate in (a World Classroom party, and two day-long excursions to Niagara Falls and Toronto), as well as other important program information.
	The students, along with three adult chaperones will arrive around *April 10. They will be picked up from the airport and dropped off at our office, Dr. Bette Stephenson Centre for Learning in Richmond Hill, where YRDSB host partners and their families will come to pick them up. The students will stay for about six weeks. They will go to school with you each day and live with your family. The group departs around *May 23. When it's time for the students to leave, you and your family will drop them off at our office to meet a bus which will take them to the airport to catch their flight home.
