#### Message from the Administration

Our winter weather this year has been unusual and unpredictable. Although we have had very little snow, this may change at any time. We ask for parent support by ensuring students have appropriate and sufficient clothing to keep them warm and dry when we are outside during recess and lunch. Unless it is extremely cold or dangerous due to icy conditions, we will be outside during recess and lunch. In addition, please partner with us by reminding your children that snow cannot be thrown at other people and to respect the snow creations of other students. It is important that everyone recognize and

accept that, in order to ensure everyone's safety, we cannot allow snowball throwing at school.

We realize that traffic and pedestrian safety is an often repeated message in our newsletter but it is critical that EVERYONE follow the rules of the road and parking lot. It is important that everyone drives SLOWLY when entering and exiting our parking lot or drop off area. Please remember to observe and follow signs and the direction of staff on duty. Drivers should always pull forward as far as possible when dropping off or picking up and this should only be done in the curb lane. Safety is a shared responsibility and we need everyone's help in this matter.

#### Kindergarten Registration

Kindergarten registration has begun for the 2016-17 school year. Children born in 2012 are eligible for junior kindergarten this September 2016. Children born in 2011 and are currently attending public school are eligible for senior kindergarten in September 2016.

#### Documents that are required for registration are as follows:

Proof of child's age - Birth Certificate, if born in Canada.

- Passport, Permanent Resident Card of the child and parents if child is born outside of Canada.

If you own:

- ♦ Purchase Agreement
- ♦ Town of Markham Tax Bill/Utility Bill

If you rent:

♦ Landlord/Tennant Lease Agreement

### **Positive Parenting TIP**

#### A Winter Wonderland of After School Activity

"Canadian winters offer a host of play opportunities for kids. When properly dressed and sufficiently hydrated, kids can enjoy hours of outdoor playtime" according to Kelly Murumets, former CEO of ParticipACTION.

In a 2013 article entitled, *Keeping Kids Active Through a Long Winter*, Kelly writes that "Kids naturally play more during daylight hours – time which is often spent in the classroom or finishing schoolwork at home." To maximize the shorter amount of daylight available during the winter months, Kelly recommends getting outside and taking advantage of the sunlight for playtime right after school while saving homework for the darker hours after dinner.

#### Additional Elementary and Secondary P.A. Days

As a result of provincial labour negotiations, a P.A. Day has been added for all York Region District School Board elementary schools on Friday, May 6, 2016 and secondary schools on Friday, June 3, 2016. You can see the full updated school year calendars on YRDSB's website.

These additional P.A. Days are mandated by the Ministry of Education. On these dates, teachers will be taking part in professional development on provincial education priorities identified by the Ministry of Education.

#### ATTENDANCE—SAFE ARRIVAL PROGRAM

Ensuring the safety of our students is our priority. Our Safe Arrival Program is in place so that we can account for the whereabouts of absent students. It is for this reason that we ask all parents to inform us their child's absence. Where it is possible, we ask that this is done in advance. Call the school at 905-472-3303 and leave a message on the answering machine or with the school secretary. If you have not informed the school of your child's absence in advance, the following steps, in this order, will be executed by the school to ensure your child is safe:

#### PLEASE ENSURE THAT THE SCHOOL HAS YOUR CORRECT PHONE NUMBERS

- 1. We will call your home.
- 2. If we do not reach you at home, we will call your work and/or cell phone.
- 3. If we cannot reach you at work, we will call your emergency contact number.
- 4. If we are not able to obtain information from your emergency contact regarding your child's whereabouts, we will speak to a sibling if one is in the school or check with a friend of your child.
- 5. Should we still not be able to obtain information on your child's whereabouts, we will consider your child MISSING and we contact **York Regional Police.**
