It is critical that all stakeholder groups work harmoniously and collaboratively and in the best interests of student achievement and well being. Our student projection indicates we will have a slight decrease in overall enrollment for next school year. All YRDSB schools must meet the classroom organization structures as set out by the Ministry of Education Primary Class Size requirement along with the class size guidelines as set out in collective agreements. As a result, combined classes will continue to form a substantial portion of our school organization. Placement of students in classes for next year will be based on the need to provide a balance of gender, ability, learning styles and positive social dynamics. The number of times a student has been in a combined class cannot be taken into consideration when assigning students to classes. We ask that parents and students take into account the complexities of school organizations given staffing guidelines and restrictions and DO NOT make requests for specific class organizations or teachers. These requests cannot be considered given the parameters noted above.

Please note that the last day for students to attend classes this year is Thursday, June 25 which will be regular day with dismissal at 2:50 p.m. June 26 is a PA Day. We ask that parents ask students to check the lost and found prior to June 22 as all items remaining will be donated to a local charity on June 24.
