Spring seems to have finally arrived – hooray! It has been nice to welcome back the warm weather, hear birds chirping, watch flowers blooming and see more people out in the community enjoying the sunshine. We want to thank the many families who are beginning to walk to and from school each day. This really helps cut down on congestion around the school and makes everyone safer. We hope the new traffic calming signs installed on the road near the school will also get people to slow down and drive safely while in the school zone.

We are seeing more students riding their bikes to school — which is great — but many are not wearing helmets. Falls from bikes can happen suddenly and the results can be devastating. Please make sure your child has a properly fitted helmet and that you review your expectations with your child when they are riding in the neighbourhood. It is also important that you check that your child's bike is in good working order, with properly inflated tires and brakes that work.

It has been a wonderfully busy month at MGPS. We offered a variety of activities that are designed to keep our students engaged and physically active. Our junior basketball teams and the badminton team competed at the Area Finals. We had our Pause to Play Day and our Jump Rope for Heart skipping day, and we just recently had our Track and Field Day. Our intermediate students had their overnight trip to Cedar Glen — they also planned and delivered a very successful day of learning for the Grade 6 to 8 students called "The Day of Us" that focused on mental health and wellbeing.

The Talent Show was a great event that allowed our students to showcase their amazing skills and abilities! Our students got to read a variety of new books in the Forest of Reading program and then voted on their favourite ones. Kindergarten Registration

We are pleased to announce that you can register your child for Kindergarten ONLINE.

Kindergarten registration has begun for the 2019-20 school year. Children born in 2015 are eligible for Year 1 kindergarten this September 2019. Children born in 2014 and are currently attending public school are eligible for Year 2 kindergarten in September 2019.

Documents that are required for registration are as follows:

Proof of child's age - Birth Certificate, if born in Canada.

- Passport, Permanent Resident Card of the child and parents if child is born outside of Canada.

Proof of Residency:

If you own:

- ♦ Purchase Agreement
- ♦ Town of Markham Tax Bill/Utility Bill

If you rent:

- Landlord/Tennant Lease Agreement
- ♦ Bank statement/Utility Bill

Cancellation Policy

Before June 1, 2019 will be fully refunded less a \$25.00 per week, per child, administration surcharge. After June 1, 2019, the full registration fee is non-refundable.

Locations

Programs are offered at <u>locations</u> in Richmond Hill, Markham, Stouffville, Newmarket, Woodbridge, Vaughan and Georgina from 9:00 am - 3:30 pm with extended YMCA before and aftercare programs available at all locations.
