November 11 is Remembrance Day and Markham Gateway Public School will recognize this significant day by holding a ceremony in our gym beginning at 10:30 a.m. All members of our school community are welcome to attend. We anticipate that the ceremony, which will include presentations from a variety of classes, will be approximately one hour in length. Please note that the ceremony will strike a tone of solemn remembrance.

By now, most of you will have heard about the recent tragedy at David Suzuki Public School. Two girls were in a traffic accident, and there were grave results. There are no words to describe this loss to the family and the David Suzuki community. Our thoughts go out to the family and all members of the David Suzuki P.S. community.

This tremendously unfortunate situation compels us to address our traffic situation here. While we see many examples of safe driving practices, we do also see some unsafe practices that are dangerous.

Everyone's safety is a shared responsibility. We know the safety of our students is of the utmost importance to all of us. Here are some safe practices to inform our driving behavior:

#### Safe Actions

- <u>PATIENCE</u> We know the kiss and ride loop can be busy at times, but demonstrating some patience makes it safer for our students.
- <u>PREPARATION</u> To make the Kiss and Ride section run more smoothly, please have your children's bags ready so they can leave the car in an efficient manner. Students may only exit and enter cars from the passenger side of the car which is adjacent to the sidewalk.
- <u>PARKING</u>- If you feel the need to escort your child to school, you need to park your car. You <u>cannot</u> park your car in the loop since this further delays the flow of the Kiss and Ride area
- <u>MOVE UP</u> in the Kiss and Ride as far as you can (but please don't cross over the crosswalk); this helps to reduce "back-ups" in the loop area.
- <u>SLOW DOWN!</u> This is especially <u>important</u> when cars are entering and exiting our school zone. Remember, children can be unpredictable. The fraction of a second gained through unsafe speed through the parking lot is never worth the possible dangerous outcomes
- <u>USE THE CROSSWALK</u> While there is an element of danger whenever you are crossing a street, it is a safer option to use our crosswalks. In addition, it is also a safe option to escort your children across the street.
