IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT(S)

PARKING LOT

Our parking lot went through a major transformation over the summer. Consultants listened to the safety concerns of parents / guardians, students, staff, and community members and came up with a

redesign to address these issues. The parking section is now self-contained, so anyone coming to park at the school will not have to cross traffic to get safely to the school doors. The new drop off circle is meant for short term pick-ups and drop offs only. To reduce congestion, we always recommend that students walk or bike to school – even when it's raining! If this is not possible, consider a pick up point away from the school such as the Centennial Community Centre. Alternatively, delaying your pick-up by even 10 minutes can make a huge difference. Students need time to gather their belongings and speak to friends at the end of the day, so try coming to pick them up at 3:15 or later and there will be much less traffic which is safer for drivers and students. We appreciate your patience and cooperation as we all adjust to the new traffic flow.

CASH ONLINE

Markville uses an online platform for easy payments of school activities.
