TERRY FOX WALK / RUN SCHOOL WIDE FUNDRAISER – FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 14

Terry Fox carved a path into the hearts of Canadians 38 years ago through his commitment, leadership and innovation. The Terry Fox Foundation invites students from across Canada to follow in his footsteps and be innovators themselves, just like Terry was. On Friday, September 14, 2018, through the hard work and organization of Markville's SAC (Student Activity Council), MAC (Markville Athletic Council), TAC (Transitions Activity Council) and the Grade 12 Leadership Class, Markville will host our own school wide Terry Fox Walk / Run and Fox Fundraiser.



Goals of Terry Fox Walk / Run:

* To broaden social awareness: Students will become positive agents of change in the fight against cancer

* To unite, just like Terry did: Students will form teams in a strong show of solidarity, while continuing Terry's legacy

* To celebrate and have fun: School spirit will soar through positive team building as they work towards a goal

* To fund Canada's most promising research: 82 cents of every dollar raised goes to fund innovative cancer research

What will happen on Fri. Sept. 14th?

* This will be a modified schedule day with all periods being approximately 55 min. followed by the Run / Walk / Fair which will take place after 1:00pm.

* Students are encouraged to fundraise at least a "Toonie for Terry" in their period 5 classes or set up their own fundraising page at <u>http://www.terryfox.ca/MarkvilleSSMarkham</u>. Prizes will be given to Top Student Fundraiser as well as Top Fundraising Class.

* Students who would like to RUN the 5 km can buy a 'Terry Fox Run Ticket' starting September 6 in atrium at MAC table for \$5 or pay cashonline. We will have teachers posted throughout the route at intersections to ensure student safety.

* Students choosing to WALK will walk a 3 km route with their Period 5 teachers (waivers signed in registration package). Period 5 teachers will take attendance before the walk and after the walk. We will have teachers posted throughout the route at intersections to ensure student safety.

* After the Terry Fox Walk / Run, there is a "Fox Fundraiser" brought to you by SMACT (SAC (Student Activity Council), MAC (Markville Athletic Council), and TAC (Transitions Activity Council)) in the courtyard and on the large field with great events such as: Minute to Win It competitions, Rep Your Grade, Photobooth, Bake Sale / Freezie Sale, Ice Cream Truck, Wax It Event will ALL proceeds going to the Terry Fox Foundation.

We are looking forward to a great event!



PARKING LOT ETIQUETTE

While a healthy mind is essential for success, we also promote a healthy body; therefore, we would encourage you to let your child(ren) walk to and from school each day. If this is not possible, and to ensure the safety of our students, staff, parents, and other community members, we ask that you follow these simple rules:

- 1. Follow the traffic flow of the parking lot as dictated by the pylons. Pylons should never be moved.
- 2. All pick-ups should occur near the front door of the school and not at random spots throughout the busy parking lot.
- 3. There are three lanes for traffic and they should be used as follows:
 - Lane closest to the school is for **buses and taxis and emergency vehicles only**
 - Middle lane is for picking up and dropping off, preferably from the side of the vehicle closest to the school building
 - Outside lane is for through driving no stopping for any pick-ups or drop-offs
- 4. Student parking should be in the spots that face Carlton Road.
- 5. The center area of the parking lot is for **staff parking only**.
- 6. Visitors to the school may park in the visitors parking area and are asked to come into the main office to register as a visitor.
- 7. Please be aware of others while navigating the parking lot. Watch for students and staff crossing before moving your vehicle.

Please help us by working together so that we all remain safe.



Red - no parking at any time

Yellow – designated drop off / pick up areas. Also consider a pick up point further away from school. Green – through driving only, for those vehicles leaving the parking lot or going to the daycare.


BICYCLE RACKS
