IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT(S)

Parking Lot Etiquette

While a healthy mind is essential for success, we also promote a healthy body; therefore, we would encourage you to let your child(ren) walk to and from school each day. If this is not possible, and to ensure the safety of our students, staff, parents, and other community members, we ask that you follow these simple rules:

- 1. Follow the traffic flow of the parking lot as dictated by the pylons. Pylons should never be moved.
- 2. All pick-ups should occur near the front door of the school and not at random spots throughout the busy parking lot.
- 3. There are three lanes for traffic and they should be used as follows:
 - Lane closest to the school is for buses and taxis only
 - Middle lane is for picking up and dropping off, preferably from the side of the vehicle closest to the school building
 - Outside lane is for through driving no stopping for any pick-ups or drop-offs

- 4. Student parking should be in the spots that face Carlton Road.
- 5. The center area of the parking lot is for staff parking only.
- 6. Visitors to the school may park in the visitors parking area and are asked to come into the main office to register as a visitor.
- 7. Please be aware of others while navigating the parking lot. Watch for students and staff crossing before moving your vehicle.

Patrick Shea – *Technology Support Technician*: Makes sure that our computers and school technology are working efficiently.






MSS LIBRARY LEARNING COMMONS

There is always so much going on at our MSS Library Learning Commons! Over the past couple of years we have been moving things around, really working on defining different spaces in response to student needs. We have come up with different zones based on the type of work students would like to do while visiting the library.

Students can select between the quiet / study zone, the moderate zone, or the collaboration zone. We also have the Green Screen Studio which can be booked by teachers for classes or groups of students. New this year we have a Sound Studio, a room that can be used for sound recordings using our new podcast kit and recording equipment; or that can be used as a silent study room for up to six students.



Students are able to access the Library page on the school website from anywhere with an internet connection. We have included lots of useful tools, information, and links to great resources. Click here to get started! Students are able to borrow items in our collection, (books for 3 weeks, DVDs for 1 week, laptops during the school day) all for free with their student card.
