BREAKING NEWS – PARKING LOT SAFETY

Earlier this morning we had an incident in the parking lot. A driver, who dropped off their child incorrectly in the bus only lane, went to leave and very nearly hit another student who had also just been dropped off. This is a very serious issue that needs to be addressed. When you are dropping students off it is your responsibility to make sure you are in the correct lane – the only acceptable spot is the middle lane, marked in yellow on the picture below. Do not park or drop students off in the bus / emergency vehicles only lane, marked in red below. Once a student has been dropped off, please look around you before pulling away. This incident happened at 7:00 am, long before the school rush began. The rules for dropping students off remain the same no matter what time of day it is. The safety of our students and staff is of the utmost importance. Please help us keep them safe by following the correct drop off and pick up procedures. Drive Safely!
