#### A MESSAGE FROM PEER TUTORING

The **Peer Tutoring** program is up and running for students seeking a peer tutor! Tutoring sessions are offered in-school during the following time slots:

- Mondays and Wednesdays during Period 3 and 4 in the Library
- Tuesdays and Thursdays After School in Rm 348

The goal of the Peer Tutoring Program is to provide support for students who are experiencing difficulty in one or more of their courses. Students may participate in 1-on-1 scheduled peer tutoring, group tutoring, or drop-in tutoring during any of the above times. All designated lunch and after school sessions are supervised by a teacher advisor.

Students seeking 1-on-1 support are to <u>submit a Tutor Request Form</u>, and will be matched with a hand-picked peer tutor to meet during a scheduled time for extra help in the subject(s) needed. Peer tutors have volunteered their time to tutor students across all grades and subject areas. The expectation is that your child will attend peer tutoring at the agreed upon time(s) with the peer tutor.

Please note that for 1-1 support, **students must personally agree and submit their** *own* **application** via their GAPPs account. In order for this program to be successful, parents should <u>not</u> be submitting applications on a student's behalf. We ask that you encourage your child to take advantage of this opportunity for extra-help, but reiterate that for attendance and optimal results, students need to recognize the benefits of working with a peer and feel self-motivated to support their learning through the program.

Students will be using their **YRDSB GAPPs email** to safely communicate with their tutor and teacher advisors. Therefore, it is imperative that students are checking their email regularly for match confirmations and other communication.

\*\*For **drop-in sessions**, students do not need to submit an application, and can simply show up to the time/location above of their choice.\*\*
