

#### **MYTH**

Leaving lights, computers, and other appliances on uses less energy than turning them off and makes them last longer.



### **FACT**

While it used to be the case that cycling appliances and lighting on and off drastically reduced their lifetimes, these problems have been largely overcome through better design.

# **DEPARTMENT SPOTLIGHT**

#### LITERACY - OSSLT

The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) is a province wide test administered by EQAO (Education Quality and Accountability Office). Every student must successfully complete the OSSLT as a graduation requirement. This year, our Grade 10's and previously eligible students will be writing the OSSLT (Literacy test) on March 31st, 2020.

After the Fall break, Markville will be hosting an "After School Literacy Program", which is designed to support your child's Literacy skills development as well as allow them the opportunity to practice the types of tasks they will encounter on the Literacy test in the Spring. The After School Literacy Program will begin on Wednesday, November 13<sup>th</sup> and end on Thursday, December 12<sup>th</sup>. It will run every Wednesday and Thursday from 3:00pm – 4:30pm in Room 224.

We also completed another Literacy Task with all our Grade 10's during Period 3 on Wednesday, October 16<sup>th</sup>. This task focused on building active reading skills, making inferences, and short writing responses. #### **GRADE 9 LIBRARY LEARNING COMMONS ORIENTATION**

At the beginning of each school year, Markville's Library Learning Commons hosts a Grade 9 Orientation event. Every Grade 9 student is invited to participate in a number of interactive activities meant to help them identify the resources they will have access to over the next four years through their library. These resources include, but are not limited to, books, e-resources & databases, a green screen studio and sound recording studio as well as a place to work either independently or collaboratively.

Markville's Grade 9 students are taken on a tour of the Library Learning Commons with Library staff, student volunteers, and interactive QR codes. At each stop on the tour, students complete Google quizzes, scavenger hunts, and collectively create a video using our green screen technology, where the Grade 9's travelled the world.
