ECO THEME FOR OCTOBER - LIGHTS OUT

October's ECO Theme is Lights Out, where we are challenged to rethink our use of lighting. When leaving a room, take a second to turn the lights out. The energy saved will reduce your hydro bill and contribute to a healthier environment for everyone.

Some lighting facts for you: Changing 5 of your most frequently used lights with Energy Star rated bulbs can save you \$75.00 a year on your energy costs.

LEDs convert electricity into light more efficiently than incandescent or fluorescent lights. This is because LED semiconductors create more photons per unit of input energy.

DEPARTMENT SPOTLIGHT

GEOGRAPHY DEPARTMENT

Markville's Geography Department has had an exciting start to the year with Grade 9 students working both inside and outside the classroom to learn about Canada's physical and human geography. Students in Ms. Percy and Mr. Cao's classes started the semester by taking time to get outside and appreciate their natural surroundings. Inspired by the Ojibwe artist and environmentalist Isaac Murdoch, students learned about Inaaknigewin, a form of governance that includes principles and quidelines for how to live sustainably and in harmony with nature. This principle has remained at the heart of our studies on Canada's physical geography and continues to be central in our learning. Students had a blast exploring Canada's geologic history using Virtual Reality viewers that took them on a journey back in time where they got to see volcanoes, early forms of life, and dinosaurs! Most recently, students have been busy participating in activities like "Amazing Race Break-In Box," simulations that have had them imagining what it would be like to experience an earthquake and tsunami in British Columbia, building resource towers and analyzing the various impacts that climate change is having on Canada's physical and human geography. Using various geographic perspectives, students have been analyzing a wide variety of issues affecting our physical environment, natural resources, and economy. Students are looking forward to upcoming simulations and review games including "Geo-conomy," Geo-Dragon's Den, Town Hall Debates and "Go Fish!"
