The grade 9 & 10 Gifted English program at Markville aims to help students transition from their elementary program and introduce challenges that continue to enrich their unique learning aptitudes. Our grade 9 and 10 courses provide a breadth of experience that reflects our students' needs and interests. We introduce a variety of literary genres and challenge students to start to make critical connections among elements of a story in order to deepen their understanding of theme. In so doing, students grapple with new skills that take them beyond reading for understanding and develop the very important critical thinking skills which are needed to succeed in any discipline. More so than ever before, institutions of higher learning are interested in how well our students communicate in written form and we know that it is through reading and critical interpretation that our writing skills *improve.* As such, we are presenting tasks which require both precision and concision in form and thought and students are constantly reminded of the importance of accessing a variety of perspectives which allows for divergent thinking. Our students rise to these challenges in ways that always inspire, and we are constantly amazed by the enthusiasm, perseverance, and creativity that they bring to their work. 
