

### **OUAC** (Ontario University Application Centre) PIN NUMBERS ARE IN

The Guidance department has received the OUAC PIN numbers for students who are planning on applying to university this year. Students will need the PIN number to set up and access their account. All Ontario University applications go through the OUAC site. It is recommended that students take some time to get familiar with the site, find out the program codes for programs and schools they are interested in, and make sure they have all the required courses. Students can speak to a teacher in Guidance if they have any questions. PIN numbers can be picked up at the Guidance office. The deadline to submit completed applications to **OUAC** is January 16, 2019.

### ECO THEME FOR NOVEMBER - WHAT'S IN, WHAT'S OUT

Staff and students are encouraged to 'Rethink' their actions before disposing of an item. It is important to be well-informed about what goes in the Blue Box for recycling and what goes in the garbage bin for landfill. Putting items in the Blue Box that shouldn't be there can ruin an entire batch of recyclable material. The City of Markham has a great Item Look Up Tool available on their website, or by clicking

<u>here</u>. Enter the item in question and get information about where that item goes. See the example below when coffee cup was entered.

Item	Solution	
Coffee Cup - Without Lid	Place this item in your green bin. Use any plastic or compostable bag. Excess organic material must be placed in a clear bag beside your green bin, labelled "ORGANICS"	Green Bin
Coffee Cup Lid	Place this item in a clear bag. NO dark, white or tinted bags are accepted. A maximum of <u>4 privacy bags</u> are allowed per collection.	Garbage
Tim Horton's Coffee Cup	Place this item in your green bin. Large soiled paper products, such as pizza boxes, should be made smaller before placing in your green bin.	Green Bin

We are so proud of how the students demonstrated growth and increased their self confidence in a supportive and friendly environment.




#### **Toastmasters Mission Statement:**

Students were also asked to complete a survey at the end of the 8 week program and the two skills they felt most developed were "Having More Confidence When Speaking" (50%), and "Speaking With A Purpose" (44.4%). The students recognized their confidence improving when speaking in front of others (66.7%). The staff advisors of the program certainly witnessed the increased confidence. We would like to send out a kudos to 100% of our student participants because they all showed improved confidence.
