# **IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT(S)**

#### WINTER WEATHER AND PARKING LOT SAFETY

With the recent snowfall and drop in temperatures we have seen an increase in traffic in the parking lot. As always, we encourage our students to walk to school whenever possible, keeping some important safety messages in mind:

- We ask that students stay on the sidewalks to get to waiting cars, or while crossing the parking lot.
- There are crosswalks where no parking is allowed in order for students to safely make their way out to waiting vehicles. Please be aware of where these crossings are and take special care to watch for any students crossing and do not under any circumstances block these areas.
- We have a number of buses and school taxis coming to pick students up after school: please do not park in the bus parking only area as that is reserved for those pick-ups.
- When entering the pick-up loop, do not block cars that are leaving the parking lot area. Just as you wouldn't block a street opening, keep this area clear to ensure traffic can flow safely into and out of the parking lot.
- Again we recommend coming a little later to pick your child(ren) up. This will allow them time to gather their belongings and for the buses and taxis to clear out.

Any students not attending a supervised after school activity are asked to leave the building by 4:00 pm. Please arrange to pick-up your child(ren) before this time. We want to remind you that there is no supervision in the building after this time.

#### TAKE OUR GRANDPARENTS TO WORK DAY


