SHSM – SPECIALIST HIGH SCHOOL MAJOR

The Specialist High Skills Major students have been busy enjoying the many field trips and certifications as part of the requirements for their designation.

This fall students had the opportunity to visit the University of Waterloo and University of Western Ontario. In the morning they received a general tour of the campus and residential areas. In the afternoon students selected specific areas of interest and received a guided information session from a student currently enrolled in the program.



A number of students had the opportunity to attend a session at George Brown called a Business Student for the Day. They toured the college and campus and had the opportunity to attend class sessions giving them insight into the life of a college student.

First Aid, CPR, AED certifications were also offered at Markville. This is a 2 day in-school certification that is mandatory for all SHSM designations and it was hosted by The Life Saving Company.



The SHSM students also observed a Mock accident staged by the Markham Stouffville Hospital. It was intended to demonstrate the dangers of driving high. Our students learned about the potentially devastating and fatal effects of smoking marijuana and driving as part of the hospital's P.A.R.T.Y program. The Prevent Alcohol and Risk-related Trauma in Youth program is held in partnership with York Region Paramedic Services, the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP), Markham Fire and Emergency Services and Dixon Garland funeral home. After the simulation the students had the opportunity to ask questions to the panel of participants.



A Counterfeit detection certification was also delivered by the Bank of Canada where the students received first-hand experience with identifying and reporting suspicious money. Most recently the Beanstock Project, a group of facilitators or "edu-tainers" inspired and engaged our students in interactive, authentic, and relevant experiences as they delivered unforgettable presentations to certify our students in the areas of Customer Service and Leadership.
