Study Tips Week #1

Get Organized! Make sure all of your notes are organized by subject. When you are ready to study for a certain exam, have all of your notes, quizzes, tests, review, and textbooks from that subject on hand. Doing this now will ensure that anything missing can be found in time to be useful.

Make a Plan! Take the time to schedule when you will study for each exam. Use a calendar and include a realistic timeline. Break each subject into chunks to make it more manageable.

Take Notes! Writing things down (on paper, with a pen!) will help you remember. Also, try saying things out loud to yourself – or to some willing friends or family members. Studies show that saying something out loud will increase the chances of remembering it later.

Use Flash Cards! Write down key concepts on flash cards and have someone guiz you.




