Study Tips Week #2

Rewrite Old Tests – Pay particular attention to questions that were missed the first time. Explain Concepts to Friends or Family – the best way to figure out if you truly understand a concept is to explain it to someone else (preferably someone not in the same class). Do they understand it after you have explained it? This can help identify which concepts need more attention or clarification. Snack on Nutritious Foods – Choose foods that have been proven to aid in concentration and memory – fish, nuts, seeds, yogurt, and blueberries. Don't forget to eat breakfast before the exam! Take Study Breaks – Cramming all the information into your brain the night before just won't work! Plan breaks when you study – for every hour of studying take a 10 minute break.

Important Information for Students Turning 18

Under the Education Act, parents/guardians have a right to access their child's Ontario Student Record if the child is under 18.

If the student is 18 or over, the Board/school must follow the privacy provisions of the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act regarding the disclosure of personal information about the student to their parents/guardians.

Students 18 or over must provide written permission by signing the <u>Consent for Information Sharing</u> form to allow parents/guardians to continue to access school-related information about the student. This includes academic progress, attendance, and behaviour.

The purpose of the Therapy Dog program is to provide stress and anxiety relief for our students as we approach semester one exams. Students will be able to talk with a St. John Ambulance volunteer, pet, and cuddle the dog(s).



As outlined by the St. John Ambulance website, the program offers many benefits to students including comfort and calming, improved self-confidence and esteem, stress relief, and distraction from pain. We trialed this program last year and had incredible success. As a result, we are hoping the Therapy Dog Program will become a part of the MSS school community and hope to have the dogs in twice a year going forward.

If your child has a sensitivity, allergy or fear of dogs, please let them know to avoid the Gymnasium during this timeframe. The dogs will only be on the school premises during 11:50-12:50 and will be supervised and contained in the Gymnasium.
