# A MESSAGE FROM OUR TRUSTEE

As we enter another month of winter, this is a good time to be thinking about our health, well-being and the importance of self-care. We know that, like all of us, our students can focus better when they feel better. Our schools play an important role in health and mental health promotion and education, and fostering well-being and mental health is one of our priorities as a school board.

There is a lot of work taking place in our schools and board to create healthy schools and promote mental health and well-being, including:

- Providing training and resources for educators on strategies to support mentally healthy classrooms for all students, including holding a mental health conference.
- Hiring identity specific mental health workers and developing partnerships with <u>community</u> partners to serve the diverse needs of our students.
- Developing a <u>Student Suicide Intervention Protocol</u> to help keep students safe in the event of suicidal thoughts or actions.
- Educating students about the risks of <u>substance use and misuse</u>, including <u>vaping</u> and cannabis.
- Providing strategies and supports for students in <u>preparing for exams</u> and <u>managing stress</u>.

This commitment is also reflected in Board policy like the <u>Healthy Schools and Workplaces</u> policy and procedures. Setting policy, which governs the operation of the Board, is one of the <u>roles of trustees</u>, and we greatly value the input provided by students, staff members, family and community members. I encourage you to look at the <u>policies under review</u> and share your feedback.

We have a lot to look forward to in 2020. At the Board meeting in December, trustees unanimously approved the addition of <a href="new permanent Indigenous Trustee">new permanent Indigenous Trustee</a> and Indigenous Student Trustee <a href="positions">positions</a>. We are committed to Indigenous Education in our Board and it is important that these voices are represented at the table. We hope to fill the positions as soon as possible and will share more information as it becomes available.

# WINTER WEATHER

Now that winter has fully arrived, we would like to share some important reminders for families.

When an **inclement weather** or **extreme cold** day is declared, school transportation (including buses and taxis) is cancelled in the morning and afternoon. Schools will remain open. If you drive your child to school, or your child takes alternate transportation, you must make arrangements for your child to get home at the end of the day. Please call the school if your child will not be attending school on those days. Students will not be penalized for missing school on these days.

There may be rare instances when **Emergency Weather Days** occur and we need to close all schools and Board locations. Please take the time to make plans in the event of an emergency school closure.

Information about transportation cancellations and Board closures will be shared through local media, <u>Board</u> and school websites, and on <u>twitter @YRDSB</u>. Parents and/or Guardians who have opted in to receiving text alerts will also be notified on their mobile device.

Our process for extreme cold, inclement weather, and emergency weather days is outlined in the Board's <u>Severe Weather policy</u>, which has been recently updated and is available for public comment. Seeking feedback from staff and community members, including parents/guardians, is an important part of the review process. All policies available for comment are sent to school council chairs and are

# **COURSE SELECTION FOR 2020-2021**

Students will once again choose their courses for next year electronically on their <u>MyPathwayPlanner</u> located on the <u>Markville</u> Secondary School home page.

There will be grade assemblies for all students on Monday, February 10<sup>th</sup>. Grade 9 and 10 assemblies will take place during Period 1 and Grade 11 assemblies during Period 2. Guidance will visit Grade 12 classes to discuss how to indicate that they are graduating on <a href="MyPathwayPlanner">MyPathwayPlanner</a> and give details for students who wish to return for a semester.

To inform parents, Guidance will be holding a Course Selection Evening Information Session on Wednesday, February 12<sup>th</sup> at 6:30pm – 7:30pm in the school cafeteria. Please attend if you are able. If you cannot attend, the slides from this presentation will be posted on the Markville website after the presentation.

## **IMPORTANT DATES:**

My Pathway Planner is open now for all students to be investigating possible courses and doing preliminary planning. However, students cannot SUBMIT THEIR CHOICES at this time.

My Pathway Planner will be open for students to SUBMIT their final course choices beginning on Wednesday, February 12<sup>th</sup> until Monday, February 24<sup>th</sup>. On Monday, February 24<sup>th</sup>, Course Selection locks for all students and they will no longer have access to make changes. It is extremely important that all students choose their courses by this deadline. Please ensure that you have reviewed your student's choices before they select SUBMIT.

Guidance will also be visiting certain classrooms to help students with course selection, i.e. Learning Strategies and ESL classes. We will also have many guidance appointments available for students to book a session with a counsellor to discuss course selection and ask questions. We also encourage students to ask subject teachers questions about courses and get their opinion on best choices as well.

After each student submits their choices, they must print a paper copy and have it signed by a Parent / Guardian. The paper copy is to be immediately returned to their homeroom teacher or directly to Guidance if a student has a Period 1 spare.
