A MESSAGE FROM OUR TRUSTEE

With report cards coming home soon, this is a good time of year to review your child's progress and to set goals for the rest of the school year.

As trustees, our goals are set out in the Board Multi-Year Plan. In the coming months, trustees will be reviewing and updating this plan. This process will include opportunities for public input, and trustees will be out in the communities talking about this. More information will be shared about this in the spring.

Developing and reviewing the Multi-Year Plan is just one of our responsibilities as publicly elected officials. Trustee responsibilities also include hiring the Director of Education, setting Board policies and the annual budget, and communicating with the public.

Exams have started! By now students will have completed their Period 1 and Period 2 exams. We wish to remind students of a few guidelines and resources Markville SS has available during exams. **Guidelines**:

- 1. Show up on time for your exam. Give yourself 10 minutes or so to get settled and prepared.
- 2. If you are late by less than 15 minutes, go directly to your exam room, no extra time will be given.

- 3. If you are late by more than 15 minutes, report to the main office for further instructions.
- 4. No cell phones are allowed during exams; leave it in your locker or in your bag at the front of the room better yet, take a technology break and leave it at home for the morning.
- 5. Find out if a calculator is required and / or allowed for an exam. No covers are permitted and memories must be cleared. The Library Learning Commons has a limited number of calculators that can be signed out using your student card.
- 6. Students may only leave the exam room in the last 30 minutes of an exam. If you are finished earlier, take the time to review the exam and remain seated.
- 7. When students are finished writing their exams they are asked to go quickly to the Cafeteria, Library, Gym, or to leave the building. Please be aware of other students still writing and trying to focus. Groups of students congregating in the Atrium will be asked to leave. If you have arranged for someone to pick you up after your exam, please ensure your ride arrives on time.

Resources:

- 1. The Library Learning Commons is open for silent study during exams from 8:00am 3:00pm. Silent study is strictly enforced to give students a place to focus without distraction. Computers are available for independent work and printing. There are a limited number of calculators and laptops that students may sign out with their student card. Extra pens, pencils, erasers, flash cards and other supplies are available at all times on the supply shelf (under the living wall). Day one of exams saw over 140 students studying silently before 9:00am!
- 2. The Cafeteria is open for group study, but no food service will be available during exams. If you work better asking questions and working through problems with other students, this is the place for you. There are glass boards available for student use.
- 3. The Gym and Fitness room will be open for some stress relief activities after exams are finished for the day. Monday, January 29th offers Volleyball and Basketball from 11:15am 1:15pm.

LIBRARY LEARNING COMMONS

The Library Learning Commons is a busy place! In the past few years there have been many changes brought about by student input. We started by moving some existing furniture around which increased the amount of seating available by 140%! Now with the carpet removed, a new circulation desk, and the conversion of an office into more student space, there is more room for students than ever before – and it is working! Students are using the space daily for individual study in the study carrels, small group study in the smartboard area, printing and using programs like Photoshop, Publisher, Sage Accounting on our Desktop computers, group collaboration using the portable whiteboard and TV, large group projects at the seminar table, a bit of relaxing in our lounge area with Bungee chairs, the outstanding work being produced using the Green Screen equipment, iMacs for editing, and podcasts using the brand new recording equipment in the Sound Studio. There is an average of just over 500 students using the Library on a daily basis – that's 2500+ students in a week!





For today's Modern Learner the Library Learning Commons strives to provide a dynamic learning environment that is responsive to student's needs. We offer a variety of seating options organized into easily identifiable zones to promote individual study, small group work, and larger group collaboration. Library staff are available throughout the day including before and after school for help with research, editing, printing, and yes – even book recommendations! So far this year circulation is up 137% over this time last year with a renewed interest in reading fiction for pleasure. We welcome book recommendations from students and have added almost all of their requests into the collection. This year has also seen the introduction of Overdrive, an online platform for accessing and reading eBooks. We are excited to share this with students who will now be able to search for, check out, read, and return eBooks from their personal devices. There are no late fees, and no worries about waiting for the Library to open in the morning.
