## STUDENT TRUSTEE ELECTION

From Friday, February 21, 2020 to Wednesday, February 26, 2020 students in Grades 5 through to Grade 11 will have an opportunity to cast their vote to select their Student Trustees for the 2020-2021 school year. Students will be able to vote for two of the four student trustee candidates. Information about the candidates, process and timelines is available on the Student Trustee website. Student trustees represent over 124,000 students in the York Region District School Board. They network with students, staff, and the Board of Trustees to share information that gives students a meaningful voice. All submissions must be made by completing this form and must be submitted by Tuesday, February 25<sup>th</sup>, 2020 at 4:00pm.

Submissions should not incorporate the YRDSB logo in the poster design. It will be added once the winner is selected. Designs can be digital or illustrated by hand and must be a portrait orientation. #### WINTER WEATHER

Now that winter has fully arrived, we would like to share some important reminders for families.

When an **inclement weather** or **extreme cold** day is declared, school transportation (including buses and taxis) is cancelled in the morning and afternoon. Schools will remain open. If you drive your child to school, or your child takes alternate transportation, you must make arrangements for your child to get home at the end of the day. Please call the school if your child will not be attending school on those days. Students will not be penalized for missing school on these days.

There may be rare instances when **Emergency Weather Days** occur and we need to close all schools and Board locations. Please take the time to make plans in the event of an emergency school closure.

Information about transportation cancellations and Board closures will be shared through local media, <u>Board</u> and school websites, and on <u>twitter @YRDSB</u>. Parents and/or Guardians who have opted in to receiving text alerts will also be notified on their mobile device.

Our process for extreme cold, inclement weather, and emergency weather days is outlined in the Board's <u>Severe Weather policy</u>, which has been recently updated and is available for public comment. Seeking feedback from staff and community members, including parents/guardians, is an important part of the review process.
