Parents / Guardians must sign the printed course selection form and have students hand it in to their homeroom teacher during the week of February 24th. LITERACY

In the next four weeks, Markville SS's teachers and the Literacy team are planning to offer Grade 10 students a series of lessons connected to building students' literacy skills. These lessons will center on teaching strategies and formulas for long writing tasks including writing a news report and a series of opinion paragraphs.

On Wednesday, February 19th during period 2, all Grade 10 classes participated in a Literacy Blitz activity around planning and writing a news report. Students were taught strategies to connect their writing to a headline and photo as well as being able to recognize the "inverted pyramid" formula for a news report. Students were given opportunities to practice writing outlines for a news report using this formula. Next week, all our Grade 10's will be given an opportunity to put their skills to use and practise writing a news report in full.

Any Grade 10 student not in a Grade 10 class during these periods have been instructed to access the lessons and activities in the "Markville Google Classroom".

STUDENT TRUSTEE ELECTION

BLACK HISTORY MONTH POSTER CONTEST

In honour of Black History Month, York Region District School Board will be hosting a student poster contest. YRDSB students will have the opportunity to submit an original poster design that centres around the theme of Celebrating Black Excellence. In order to participate, contestants must be a current student of YRDSB and must submit an original design of their making.

DEPARTMENT SPOTLIGHT

MATH DEPARTMENT

In November, the Math department hosted the Canadian Open Mathematics Challenge (COMC) and the Canadian Intermediate/Senior Math Contests (CISMC). A total of 56 students wrote the COMC and 162 Grade 11 and 12 students wrote the CISMC.



The Math department would like to recognize Grade 11 student, **Arthur Bright**, for his outstanding achievement on both the COMC and CSMC. Arthur earned the top score on both contests at Markville. His impressive score for the Canadian Open Math Challenge placed him in the 98.97th percentile of all contest participants. Arthur has qualified to participate in the Canadian Mathematics Olympiad, which is the top national level competition, taking place in March 2020. Congratulations Arthur!

Several other Markville students had impressive results for the COMC, scoring in the top 10% of all contest participants: Max Jiang (95.85th percentile), Balaji Venkatesh & Jason Zhang (93.78rd percentile), Kevin Guo (92.61nd percentile) and Edward Zhou (91.34st percentile).

During third and fourth periods, the committee organized activities for all students to participate in. These activities included "Guess the Riddle" and "Learn How to Write Your Name in Chinese", but the most popular event was bubble tea. Many students lined up to purchase a cup of bubble tea, choosing either the mango flavoured, or the majority's favourite, panda flavoured tea. A student and one of the organizers, Thomas Huang, commented that "it was great when I got to celebrate the Lunar New Year with the whole school. Also, it is my final year at Markville, so it was a fantastic memory".
