#### SCIENCE STUDENTS EXCEL AT YORK UNIVERSITY COMPETITION

Last Thursday, ten of our grade 11 students represented Markville at the York University Tri-Sci Tournament. Our competitors were divided into two teams that competed against other York and Toronto high school teams in science-related challenges involving skill-testing questions and hands-on tasks.

Both Markville teams demonstrated their knowledge, teamwork, and ability to perform under pressure by earning a spot in the top 4 and advancing to the final round of the competition.

After the final round was completed and the points were tallied, the team of Sarika Sharma, Michael Ding, Balaji Venkatesh, Jennifer Zhuo and Ivan Zhang received 3rd place and bronze medals for their fantastic effort.

Our second team, consisting of Jason Zhang, Emily Liang, Michelle Zhang, Kevin Tong and Victor Liu, finished the day having earned over 90% of the available points. This amazing score was more than enough to earn a spot at the top of the podium winning gold medals and the championship trophy!

Congratulations to both teams on a wonderful day and for representing Markville and the Science Department. We are all very proud of everyone's accomplishments.

# **GRADE 10 LITERACY TEST - MARCH 27<sup>TH</sup>**

The OSSLT (Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test) will be written this year on Wednesday, March 27<sup>th</sup>. Grade 10 students and any other eligible students will write the test on that date. Markville is holding 5 Literacy Blitz events over the next few weeks to prepare students for the OSSLT. Guides, tips, and more information for parents about the test is available on the EQAO (Education Quality and Accountability Office) website. Questions and Answers about the OSSLT are available in many languages. March 27<sup>th</sup> will have a modified schedule to give students writing the test the best possible environment. Only students writing the OSSLT will be attending school. No regular classes will be held on March 27<sup>th</sup>. # PROJECT ETHOS (PUBLIC SPEAKING CLUB)

Markville's Project Ethos is a student-led club committed to improving the public speaking skills of students. Eight workshops are held throughout the school year which contain various activities that promote public speaking. These workshops also educate members about presentation skills which are useful in public speaking situations. In addition to these fun and engaging activities, students are led through debates about current challenging issues. Members are encouraged to volunteer for impromptu speeches held at the beginning of workshops to practise their skills in front of an audience and to develop their confidence while speaking in front of others. Markville's Project Ethos is dedicated to providing a comfortable and collaborative environment that challenges students to improve their ability to communicate effectively.







#### THOUGHT CAFÉ

Thought Café is a student-led club whose aim is to advance the understanding of philosophy. Members attend meetings every two weeks to relax their mind and participate in Socratic discussions. These meetings educate students about philosophical concepts through presentations; afterwards, they participate in activities that enhance their understanding as well as demonstrate the real-life applications of the concepts covered. For instance, members engage in discussion to challenge their critical thinking and presentation skills as well as reinforce their understanding of the concepts in question. Students also occasionally benefit from a fresh cup of tea to ease the stress of a school day. Thought Café is dedicated to providing students with a place to present their ideas as well as train their minds.
