# **OSSLT MODIFIED SCHEDULE – APRIL 10<sup>th</sup>**

Grade 10 and other eligible students will be writing the OSSLT (Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test) on Tuesday, April 10<sup>th</sup>. In order to create the best possible environment for students who will be writing the test, and to accommodate changes in EQAO (Education Quality and Accountability Office) policy, secondary schools will be following an exam style day on April 10<sup>th</sup>. This means that only those students who are writing the OSSLT will be required to attend school. No regular classes for grades 9, 11, and 12 will occur that day. Once students have finished writing the OSSLT, they will be dismissed for the day. Students who are writing the OSSLT will come to school at their regular start time, 8:20am.
