Second semester has been a very busy time in the Markville Music Department. We have had highly successful appearances in the Kiwanis Music Festival of Greater Toronto, the OBA Concert Band Festival, and the York Region Music Alive Festival. All of the Markville Music ensembles achieved top honours, winning five first place awards, six platinum ratings, ten gold ratings, and five scholarships for outstanding performances. In addition, Markville Music received nine invitations to compete in the MusicFest National Competition, and the Symphonic String Orchestra was selected to compete in the OMFA Provincial Championships.

In April, senior music students traveled to Orlando, Florida to participate in the **Disney Performing Arts Program**. In addition to getting the opportunity to enjoy the many attractions at Walt Disney World, Markville Music students participated in workshops with outstanding Disney clinicians, heard world-class Disney musicians performing in a variety of genres and ensembles, and performed for audiences from all over the world.

Our performance season will wrap up with our annual *Markville Pops* concert series on Monday, May 6th and Tuesday, May 7th at Markham Theatre. This year our theme is "*Music of the Masters: A Salute to the Great Composers"*, and will highlight exceptional compositions by both traditional and contemporary composers. The concerts will feature all of the major performing ensembles from the Markville Music Department (including our concert bands, string orchestras, and choir), as well as groups from our neighbouring elementary schools (Central Park P.S., James Robinson P.S., Ramer Wood P.S., and Unionville P.S.).

Finally, the Markville Music Department's annual Music Banquet will take place on Thursday, May 23th at the Pickle Barrel at Markville Mall. This semi-formal event is an end-of-year celebration of the Music Department's accomplishments that will include a buffet dinner, an awards ceremony, and a dance.
