Congratulations go to seven Markville students who were recognized by York Region District School Board for winning the Government of Canada History Award. The students attended Applause! at the Board office in Aurora, an event held monthly in recognition of outstanding achievements.

DEPARTMENT SPOTLIGHT

ENVIRONMENT

Markville students have continued to be actively involved in many environmental initiatives and activities this year. Students in the Eco Club began their year weeding and watering the plants in the school's gardens. In the spring, the team will plant flowers and small shrubs that will attract and support native butterfly species with suitable food sources and shelter.





Students in the Eco Club have also been busy with waste management. Students conducted a school wide waste audit in the fall. Results were analyzed and measures have been taken to decrease contamination rates and increase diversion rates. In addition to our 3 tier waste system, students collect and package toner cartridges, batteries, and white board markers to be recycled. Milk bags have also been collected for a mat that they have been weaving to be sent to those in need. The city of Markham came to give an interactive presentation to a few classes about waste water. Environment students went out to analyze the health of local stream water. These activities amongst others will help towards the school's application and maintenance of Ontario EcoSchools Platinum status.











Beyond the classroom, Markville's students have experienced many learning environmental opportunities and successes. Two teams were sent to represent Markville at the regional Envirothon competition, a competition that allows students to develop and expand their knowledge, problem solving, and critical thinking skills in issues related to the environment. The junior team of Arthur Chen, Anson He, Freda Li, Emily Liang and Kevin Tong took second overall. The senior team of Winnie Lin, Elena Parkinson, Rachel Ruffo, Florence Sy and James Yuan won in four out of five categories placing them first overall. The senior team will advance to represent York Region at the provincial competition!









MUSIC DEPARTMENT

The Markville Music Department had one of its most successful years of festival competition with appearances in the Kiwanis Music Festival of Greater Toronto, the OBA Concert Band Festival, and the York Region Music Alive Festival. All of the Markville Music ensembles achieved top honours, winning four first place awards, seven platinum ratings, nine gold ratings, and seven scholarships for outstanding performances. In addition, Markville Music received ten invitations to compete in the MusicFest National Competition, and the Symphonic Band and Symphonic String Orchestra were selected to compete in the OMFA Provincial Championships.



Our concert season will officially come to an end with our "Markville Pops" concert series on Monday, May 7th and Tuesday, May 8th at the <u>Flato Markham Theatre</u>. This year's theme is "A Musical Journey Around the World". The concerts will feature all of the major performing ensembles from the Markville Music Department (including our concert bands, string orchestras, and choir), as well as groups from our neighbouring elementary schools (including Central Park Public School, James Robinson Public School, Ramer Wood Public School, and Unionville Public School).

The Markville Music Department's annual Music Banquet will take place on Thursday, May 25^{4h} at the Pickle Barrel at Markville Mall. This semi-formal event is an end-of-year celebration of the Music Department's accomplishments that will include a buffet dinner, an awards ceremony, and a dance.
