# **DEPARTMENT SPOTLIGHT**

#### **GEOGRAPHY DEPARTMENT**

Geography at Markville would like to welcome its newest staff member to the department: Nona Wright. Students in our Grade 9 Geography class have had an active and engaging semester learning about Canada's diverse physical and human geography. Students started the semester learning about Canada's physical geography by participating in a variety of activities, such as role-playing, simulation, debates, and focus groups. Inspired by April's in-school field trip to the Library to watch Kayak to Klemtu for National Canadian Film Day and participate in a Skype chat with Shianne McKay, Project Manager at the Centre for Indigenous Environmental Resources, this month the Grade 9 Geography students are using the different geographic perspectives to explore different issues in Indigenous communities. Some of the case studies that students have explored include the housing crisis in Attawapiskat, building of the Jumbo Valley Ski resort, and the deforestation of Clayoquot Sound. At the end of the month, students will research and become familiarized with famous and historic Indigenous figures in Canada and will present their findings to the class in order to further their learning of Indigenous cultures.
